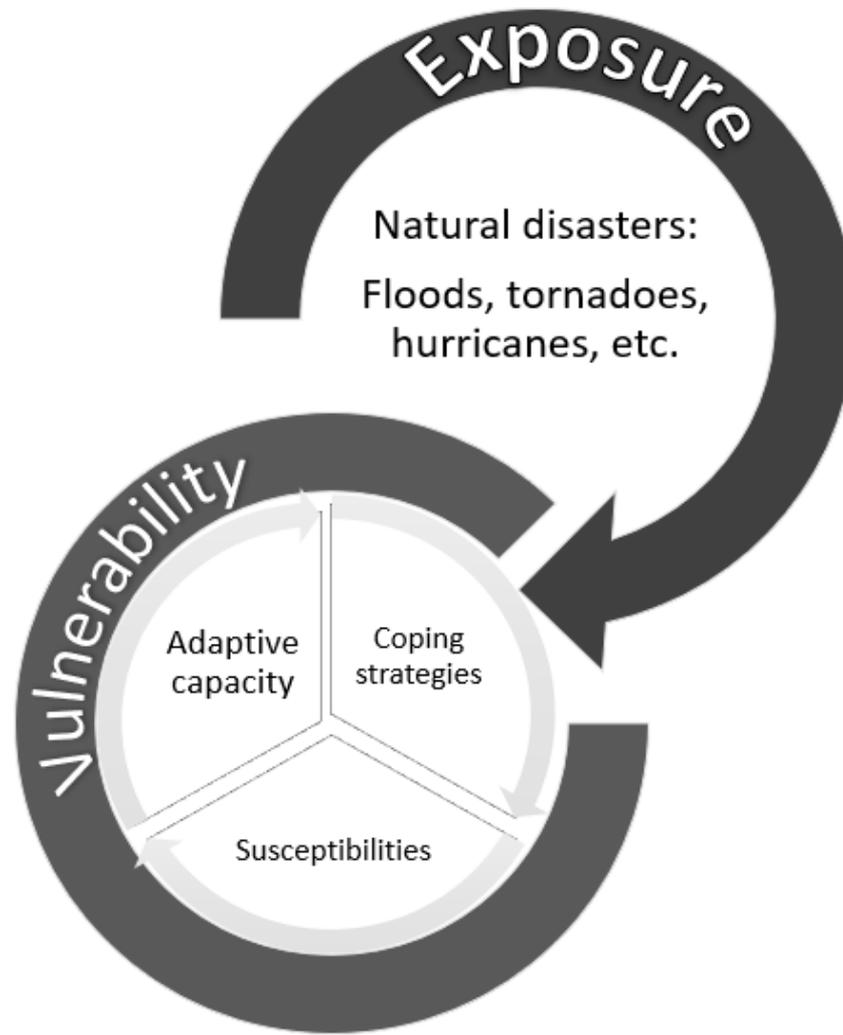

# Vulnerability in Texas & Harris County

- ▶ After Hurricane Harvey hit Houston in August 2017, the University of Houston's Hobby School of Public Affairs initiated a five-year survey study to understand:
  - ▶ Long-term experiences of people impacted by Harvey and other natural disasters
  - ▶ Preparedness and coping strategies to natural disasters
  - ▶ How individuals, community organizations, government, and private sector leaders try to mitigate the consequences of natural disasters
- ▶ This presentation covers results from the fourth wave of the Hobby School Harvey Survey
  - ▶ The survey was fielded between December 22, 2021 and March 2, 2022
  - ▶ Our analysis focuses on respondents' experience and vulnerability to natural disasters
  - ▶ We develop an index of vulnerability for the Houston area, for which we draw on the CDC's Social Vulnerability Index (SVI)

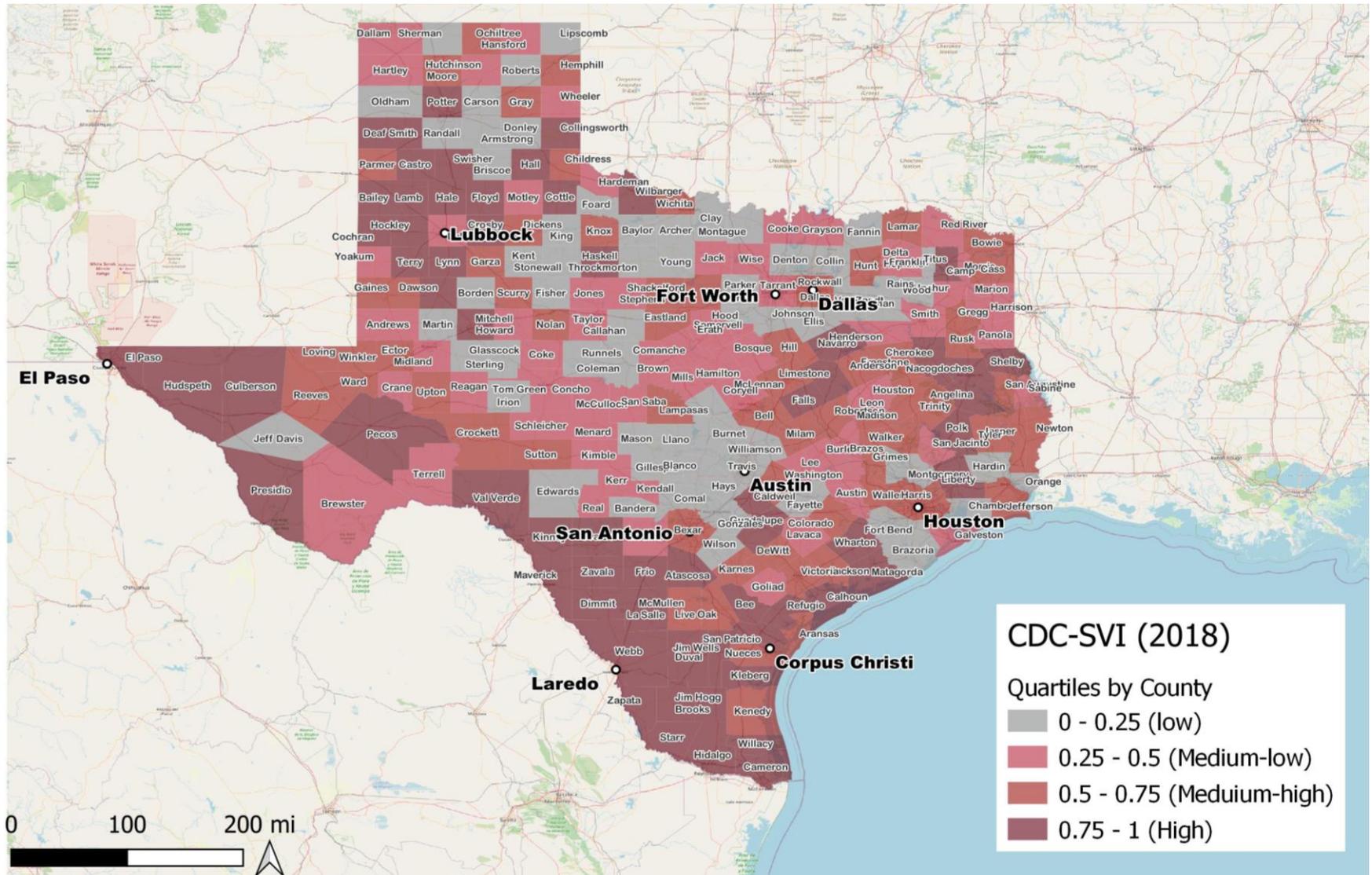


# Vulnerability in Texas & Harris County

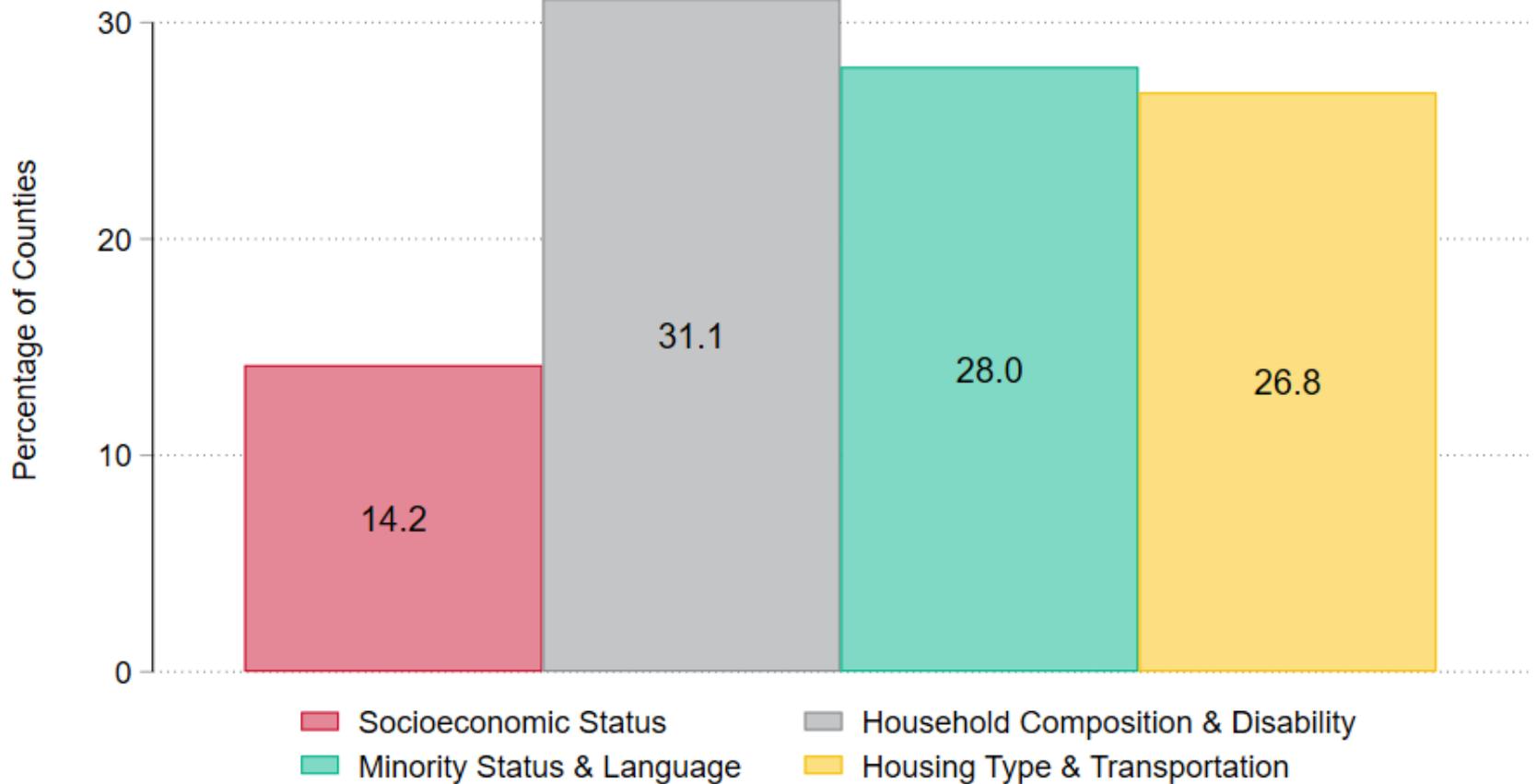
- ▶ Vulnerability to natural disasters determine community's resiliency to future hazards
  - ▶ Household vulnerability encompasses many concepts, such as exposure, susceptibilities, adaptive capacity, and preparedness
  - ▶ Different socio-economic conditions, affect a community's ability to prepare, withstand, recover, and prevent loss in the event of natural hazards or external shocks, including:
    - ▶ High poverty rates
    - ▶ Low percentage of vehicle access
    - ▶ Inability to communicate in English
    - ▶ Physical disabilities
- ▶ Household vulnerability varies across Texas; the most prevalent types of vulnerability, as defined by the CDC, are:
  - ▶ Minority Status & Language vulnerability
  - ▶ Household Composition & Disability vulnerability
- ▶ We analyze patterns of survey responses on the impact of natural disasters by the two binary measures of vulnerability constructed



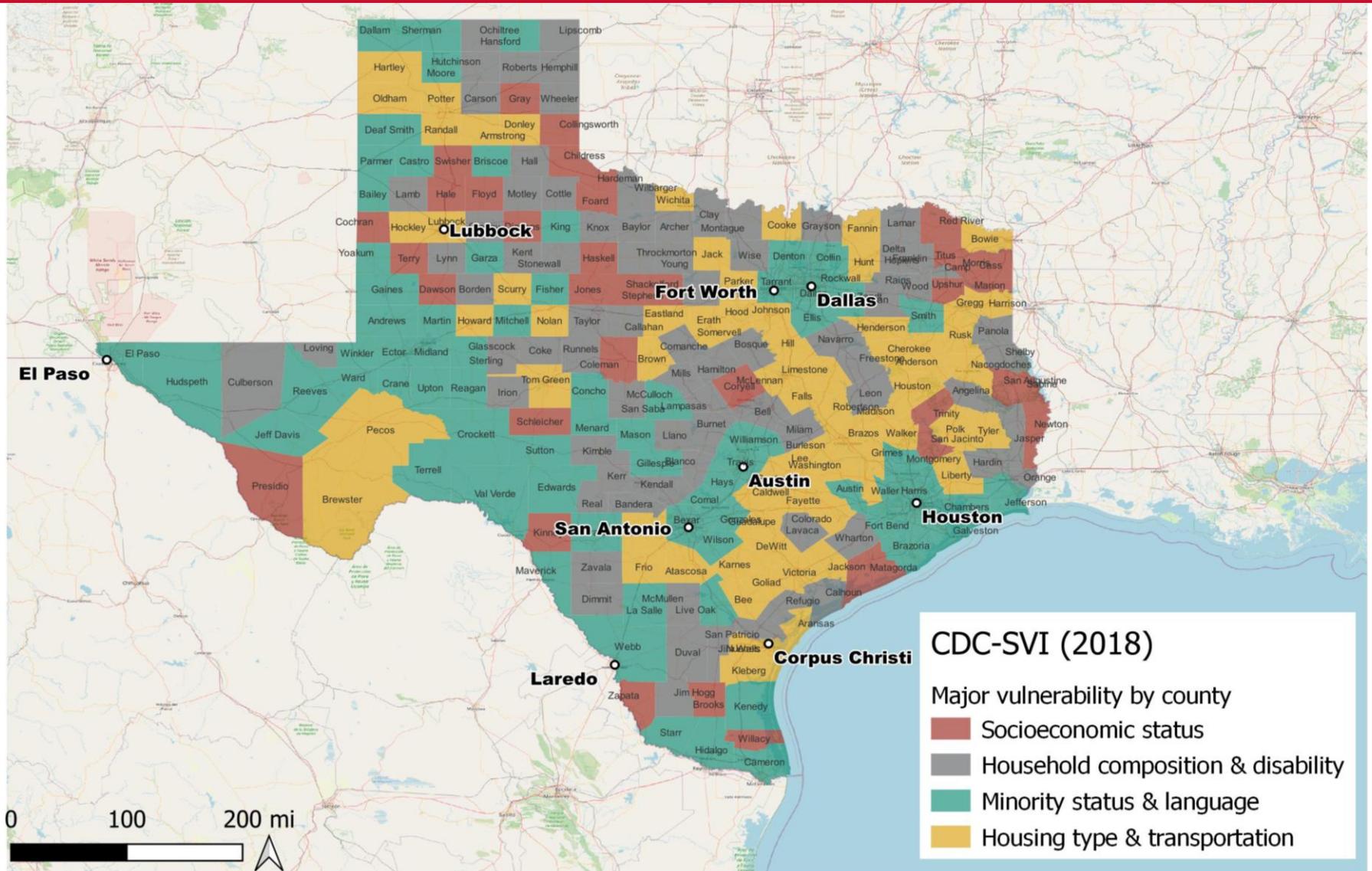

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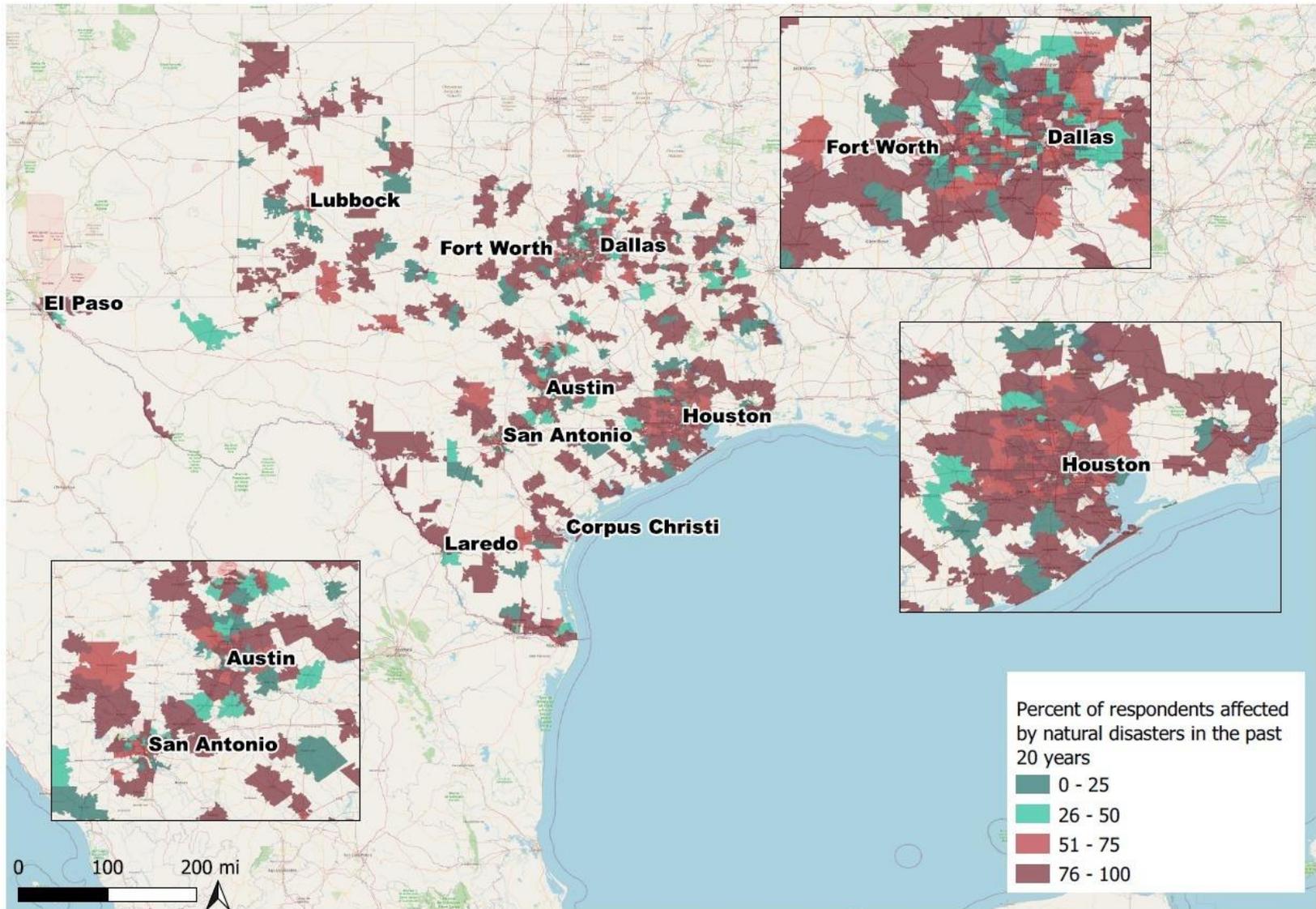
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# Natural Disasters and Vulnerabilities

- ▶ Compared to the rest of Texas, Harris County has been substantially more affected by natural disasters in the past 20 years.
  - ▶ Most respondents were affected by:
    - ▶ Winter Storm Uri (2021), with highest percentage of affected respondents
    - ▶ Hurricane Harvey (2017), which ranked second
- ▶ While most respondents in Harris county were affected by extreme cold and flooding, the impact varied by socio-demographic characteristics and vulnerability status:
  - ▶ Vulnerable households in terms of minority status, language, household composition, and physical disability were affected the most
  - ▶ A higher percentage of respondents classified as vulnerable based on Minority Status & Language vulnerable were affected by flooding
  - ▶ Household Composition & Disability vulnerable households were more affected by tornadoes

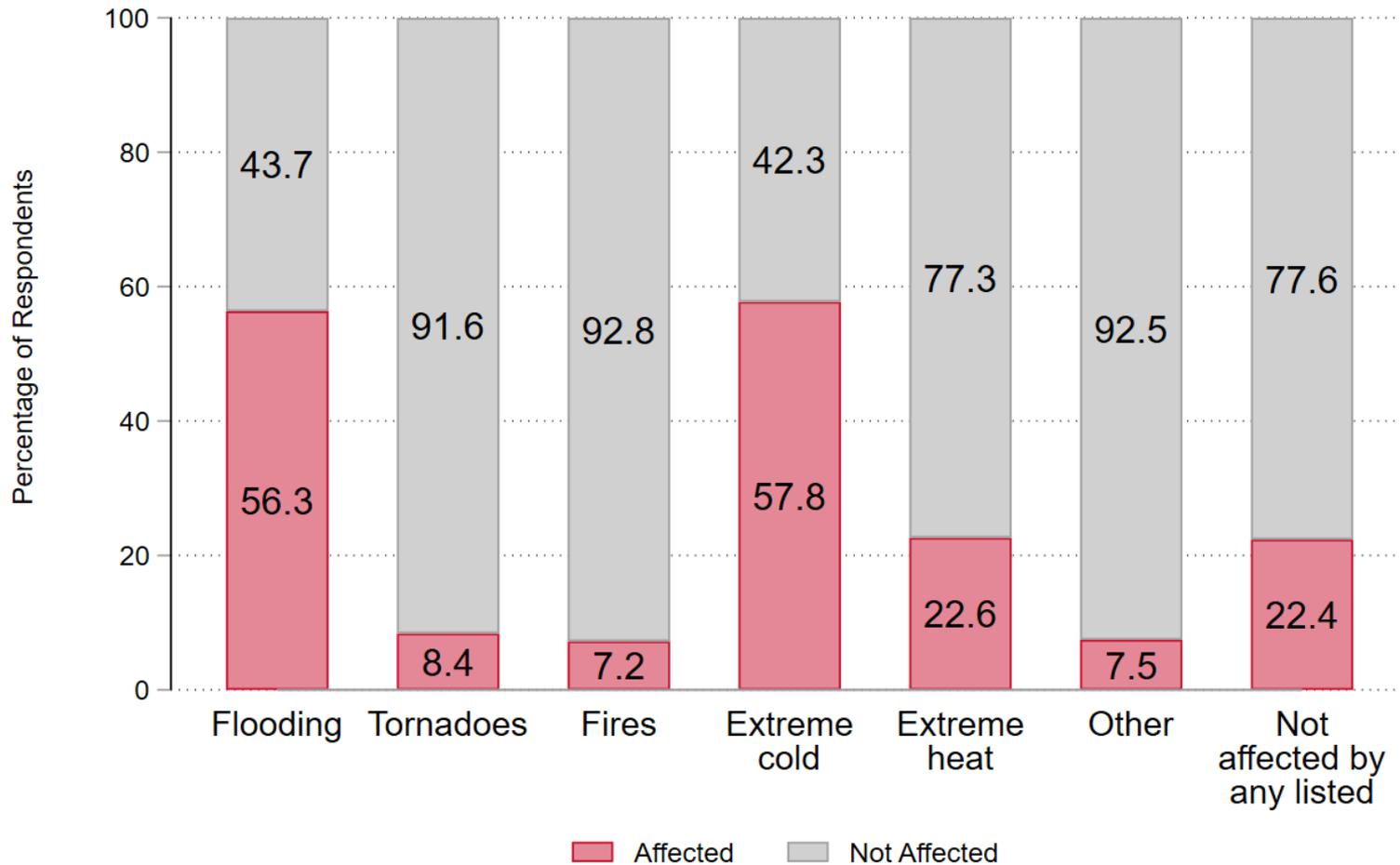

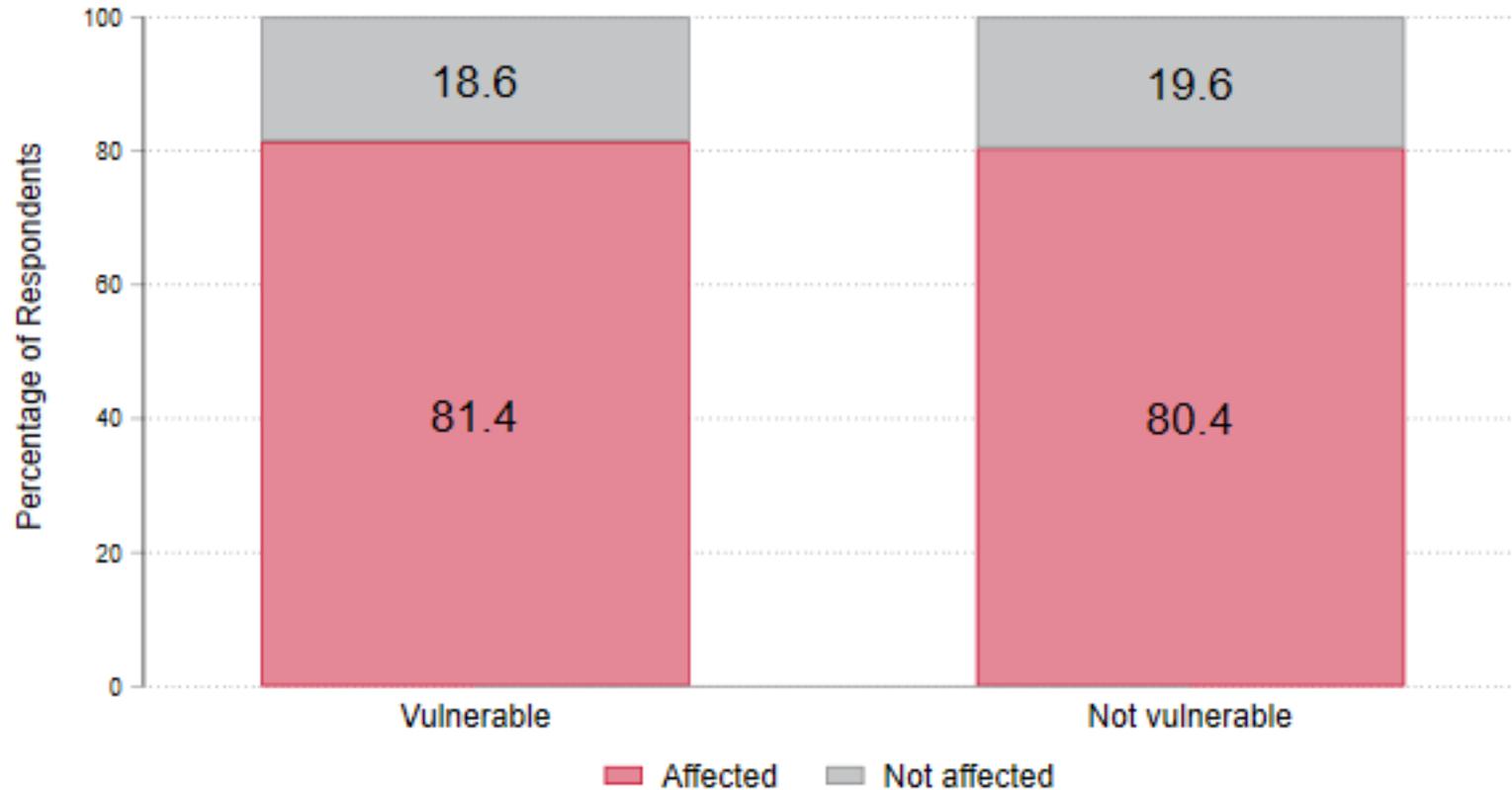

## Affected by Natural Disasters in Past 20 Years, Harris County



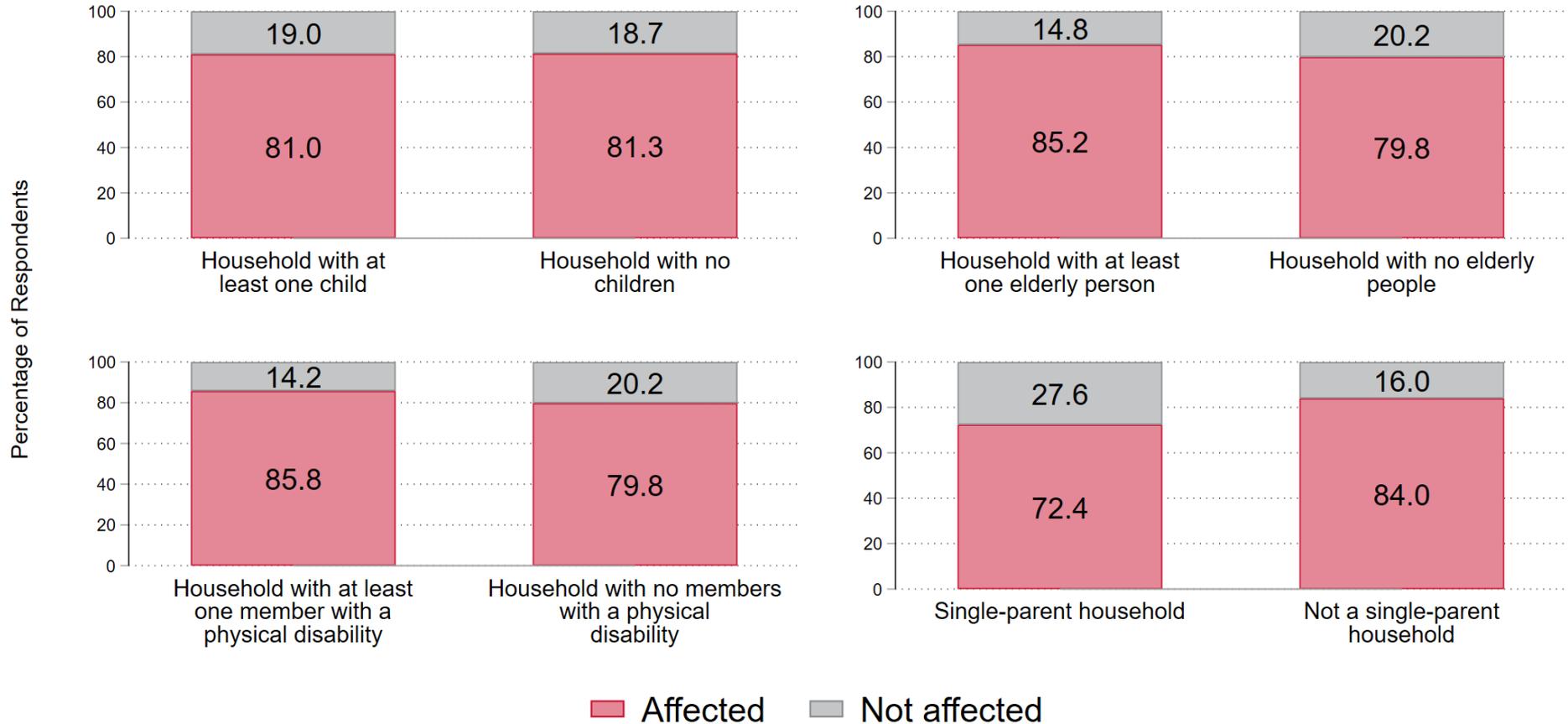

## Affected by any Natural Disaster by Household Composition & Disability Vulnerability, Harris County



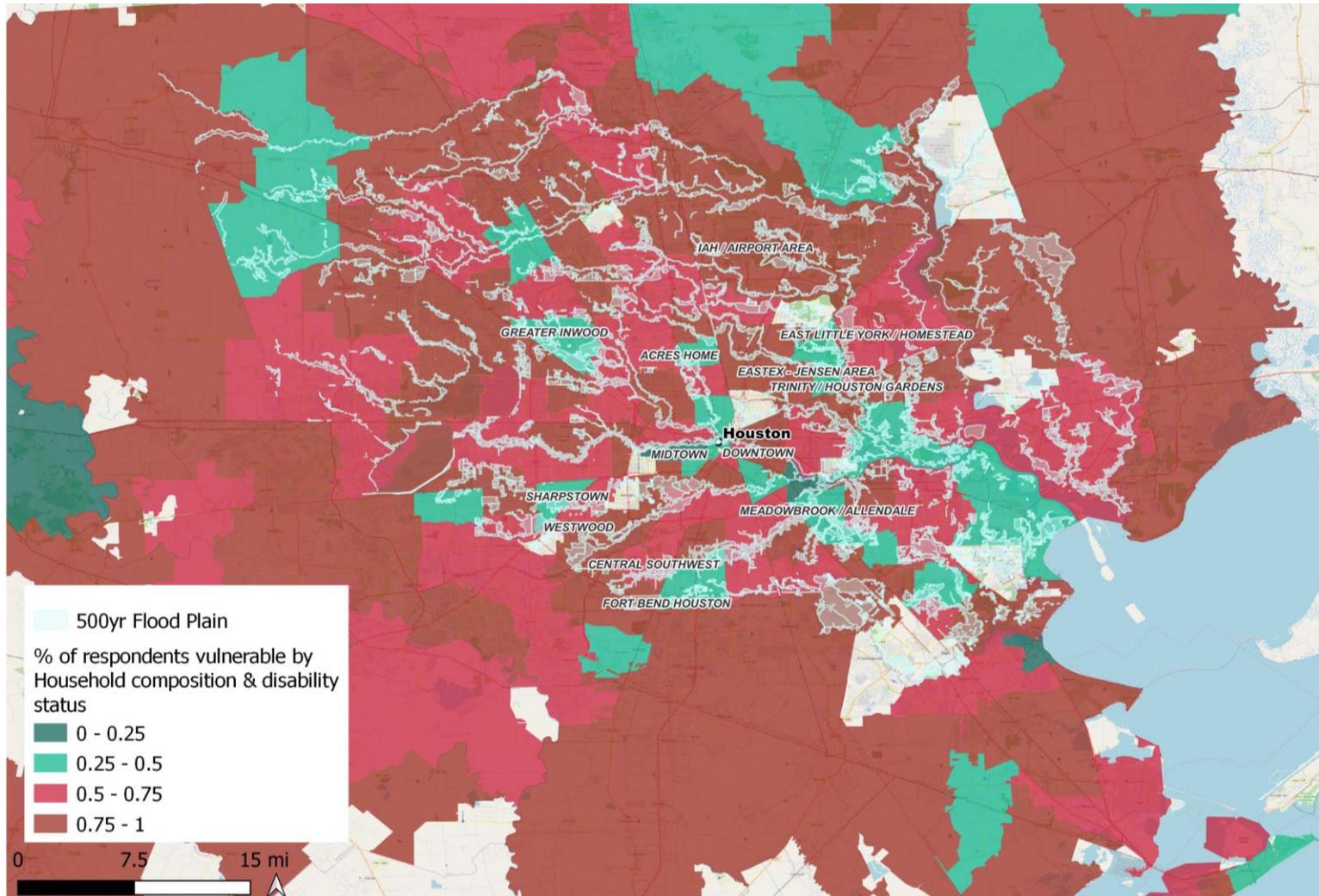

## Affected by Any Natural Disaster by Household Composition & Disability Vulnerability Categories, Harris County



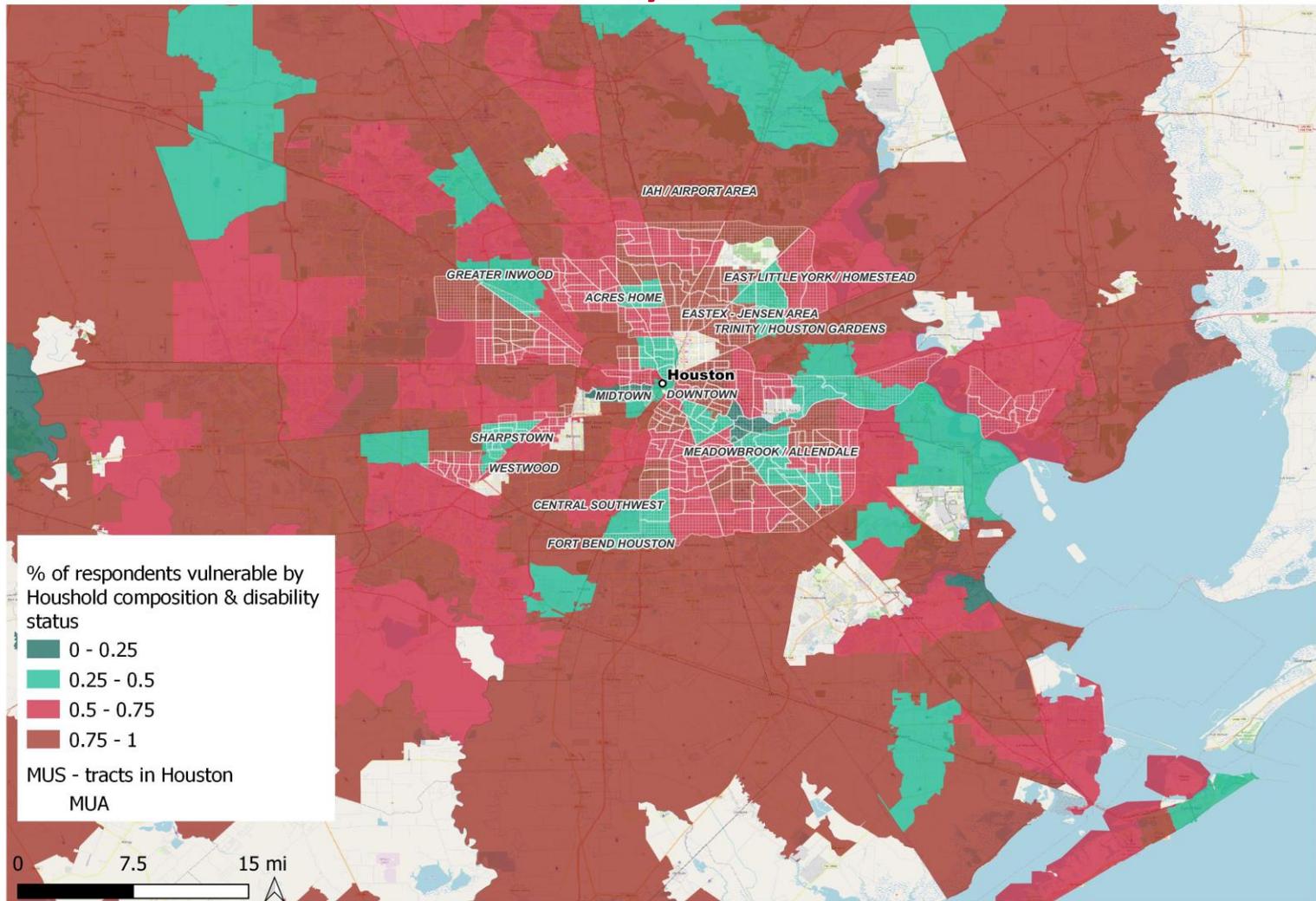

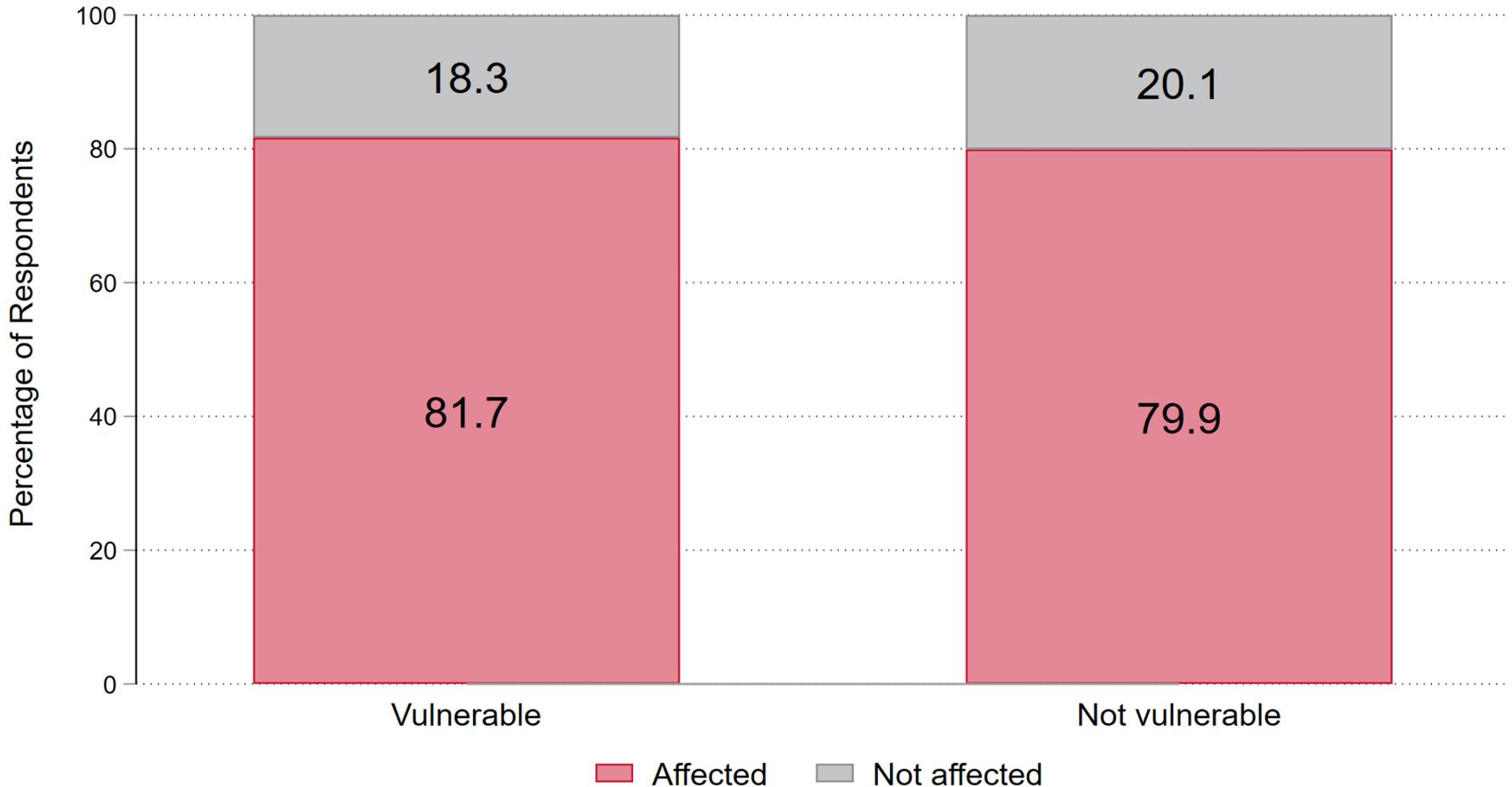

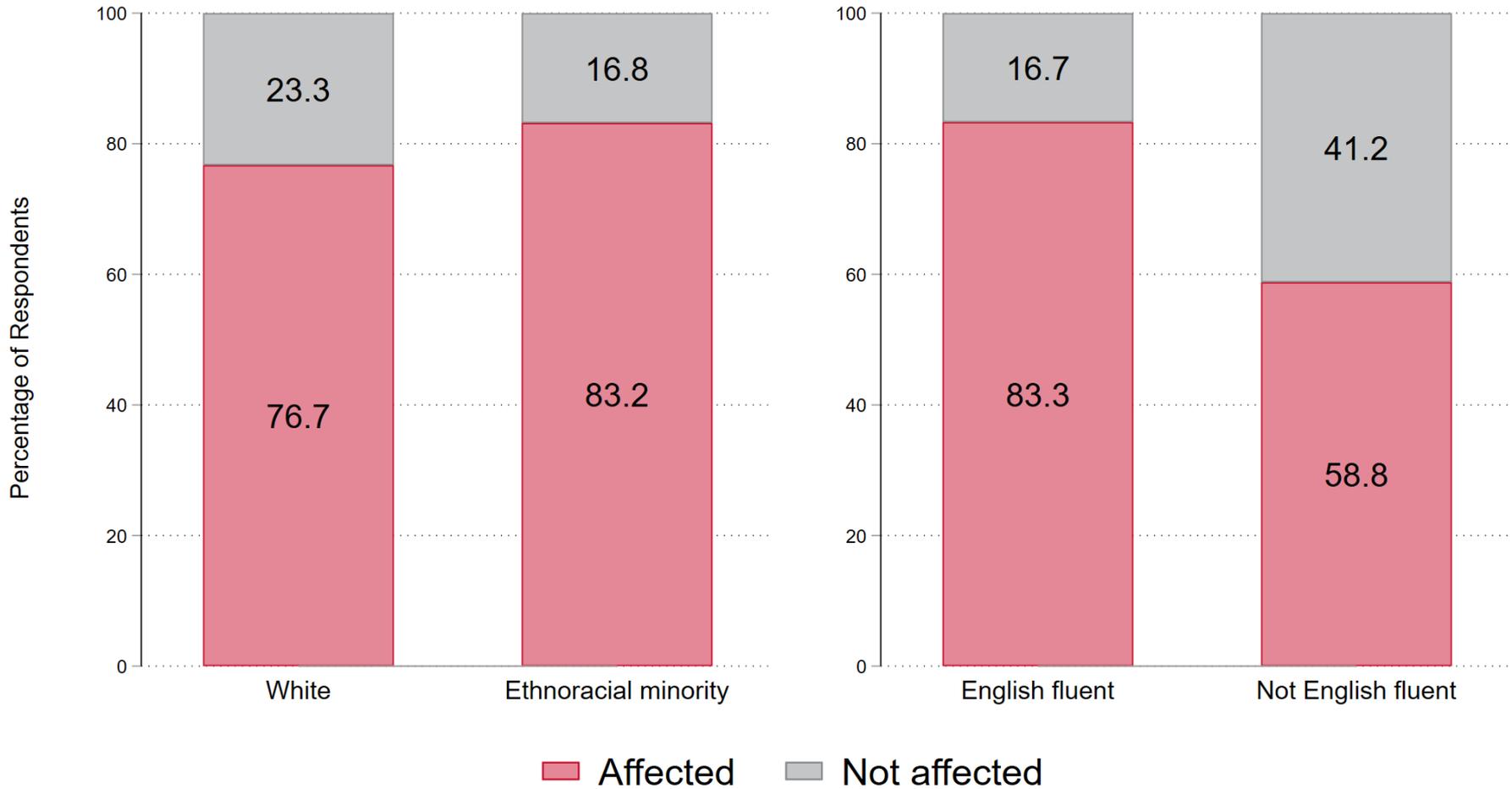

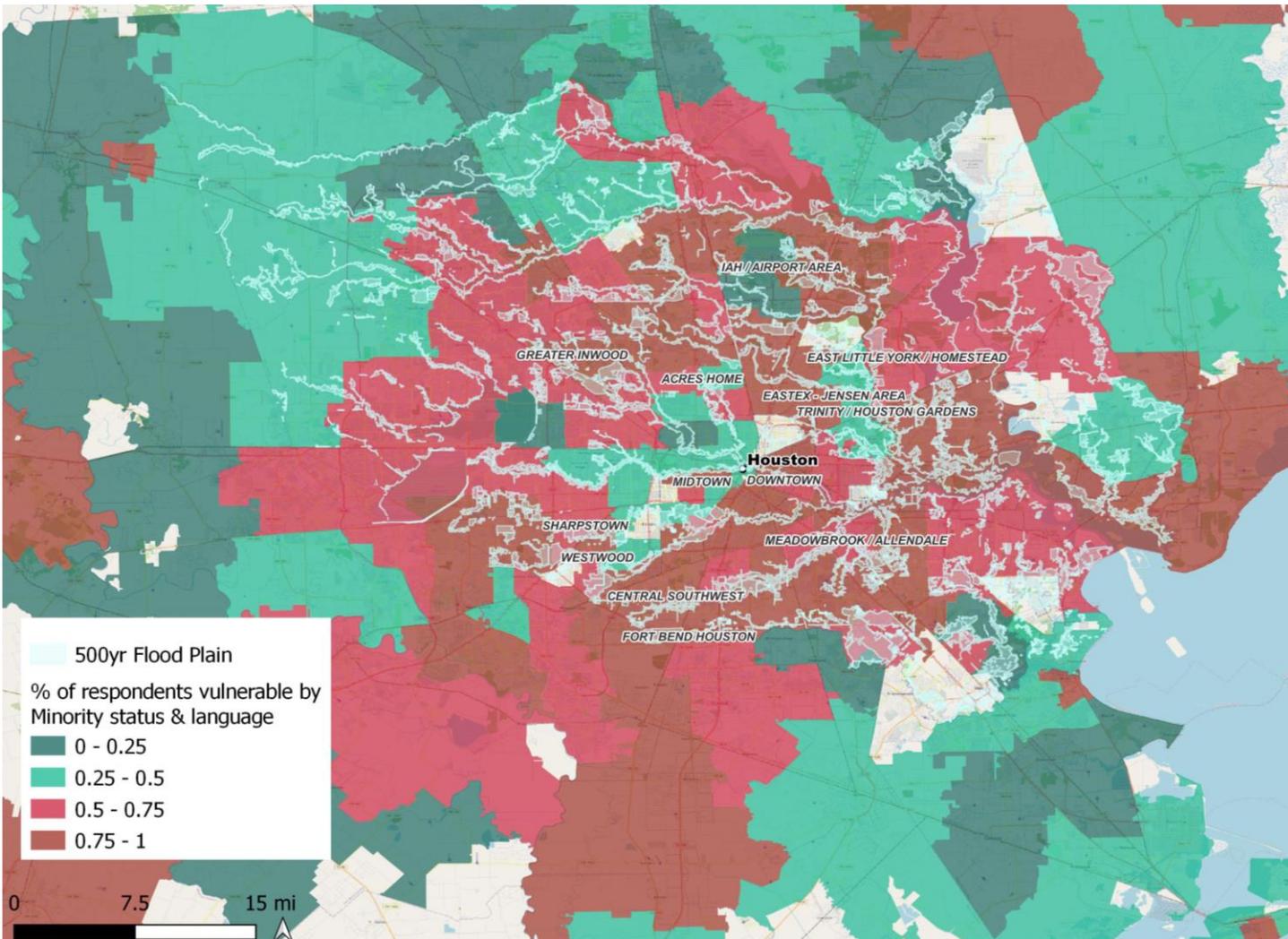

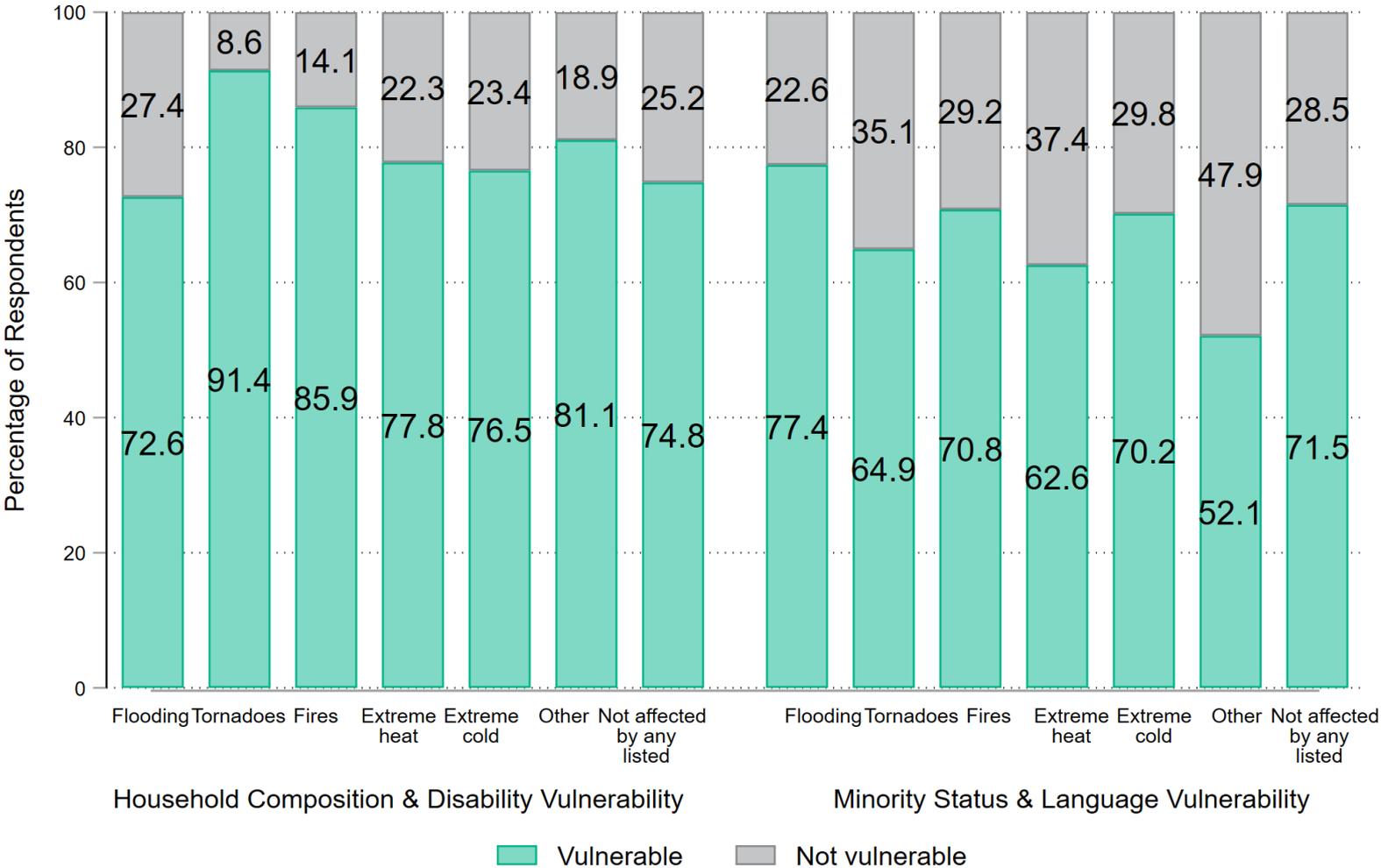

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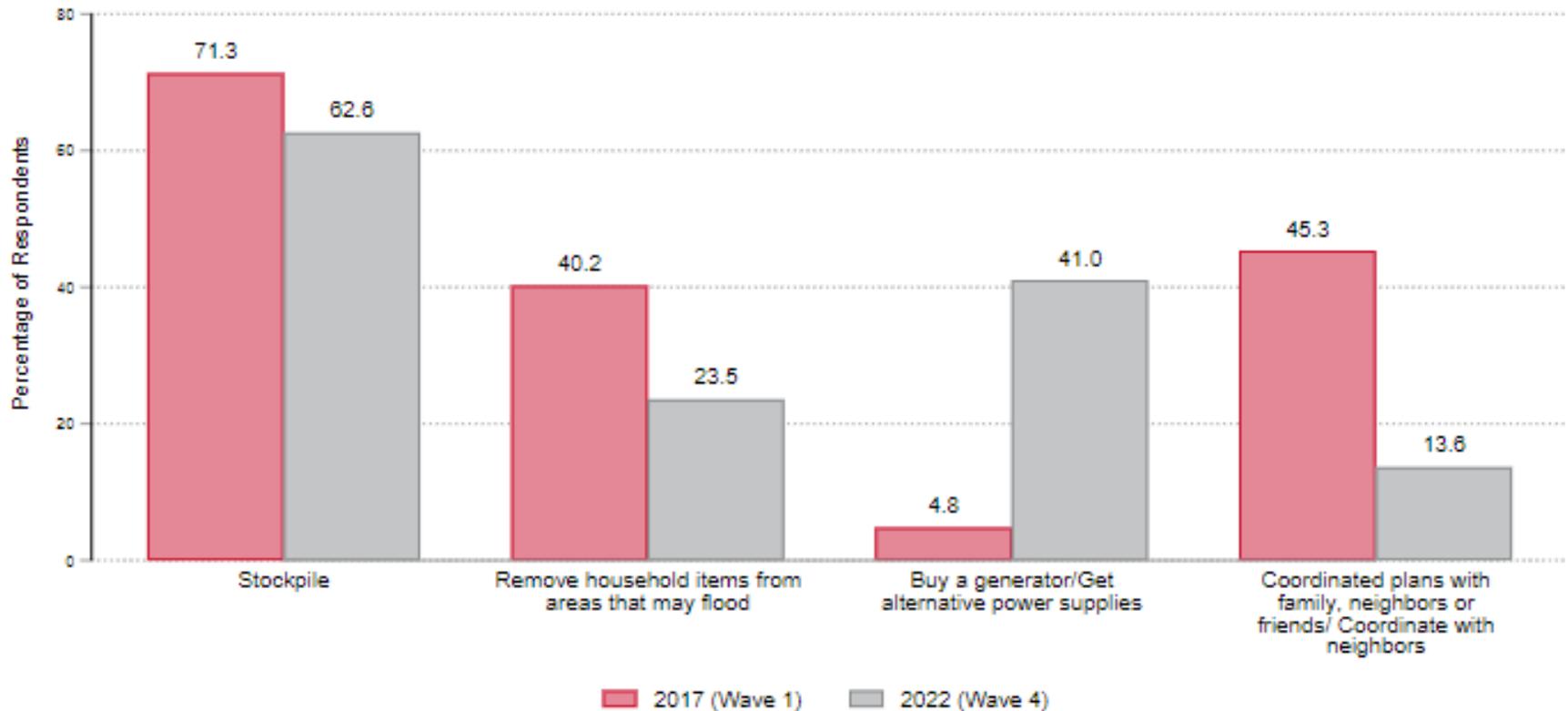
# Patterns of Preparedness

- ▶ Almost 70% of respondents reported having prepared for the 2021 hurricane season in Harris County
  - ▶ The highest percentages prepared by stockpiling, getting alternative power supply, and by subscribing to local emergency notifications
  - ▶ There has been a change in the way people prepare for disasters: more prepared by getting alternative power supplies
- ▶ In general, those that were affected by Hurricane Harvey prepared more than those not affected
- ▶ Vulnerable households prepared slightly more than those that were not vulnerable, especially those with Minority Status & Language Vulnerabilities
- ▶ More white and Black or African American respondents reported NOT preparing compared to Asian or Pacific Islanders and Hispanics/Latinos



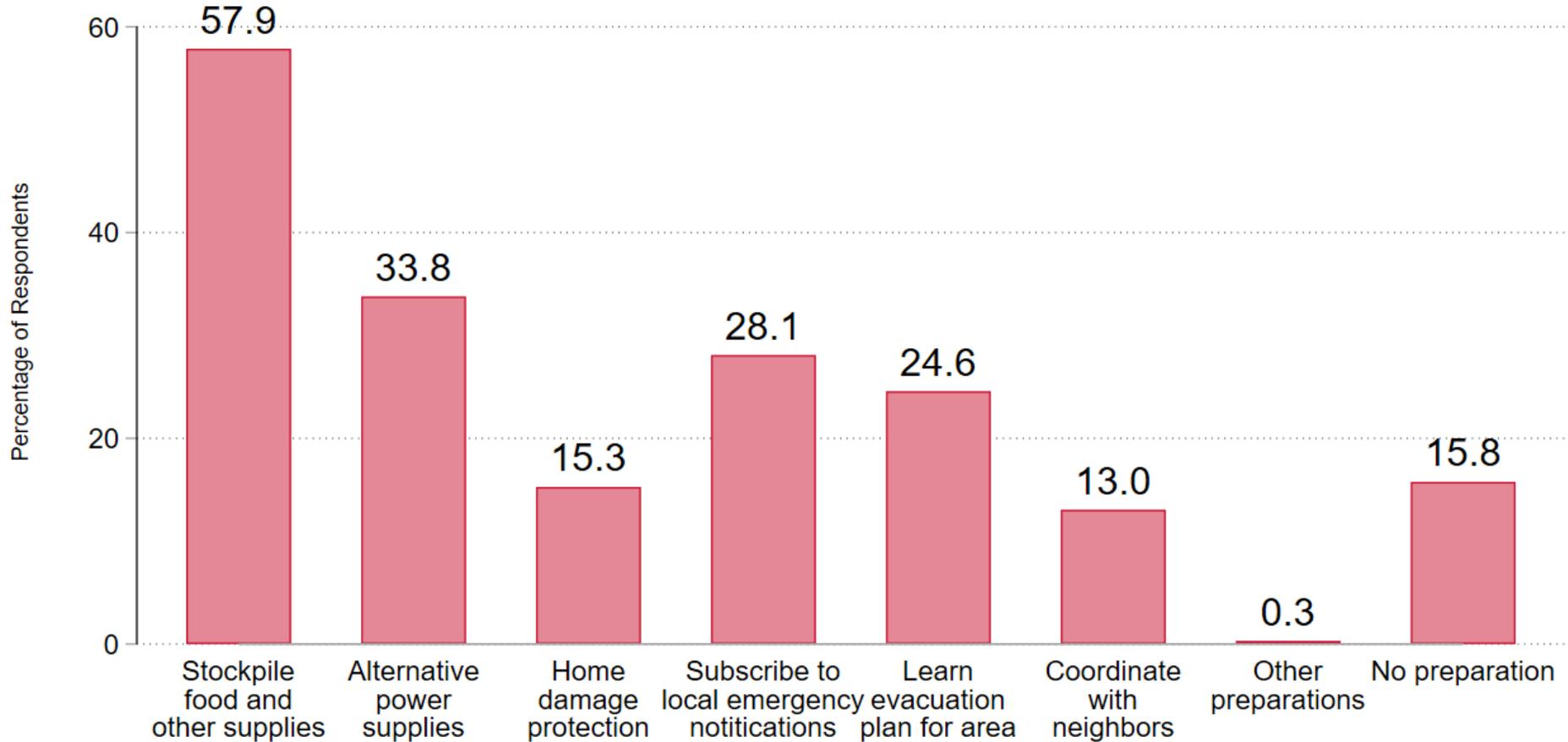

## Hurricane Preparedness in the Greater Houston Area, 2017 and 2022



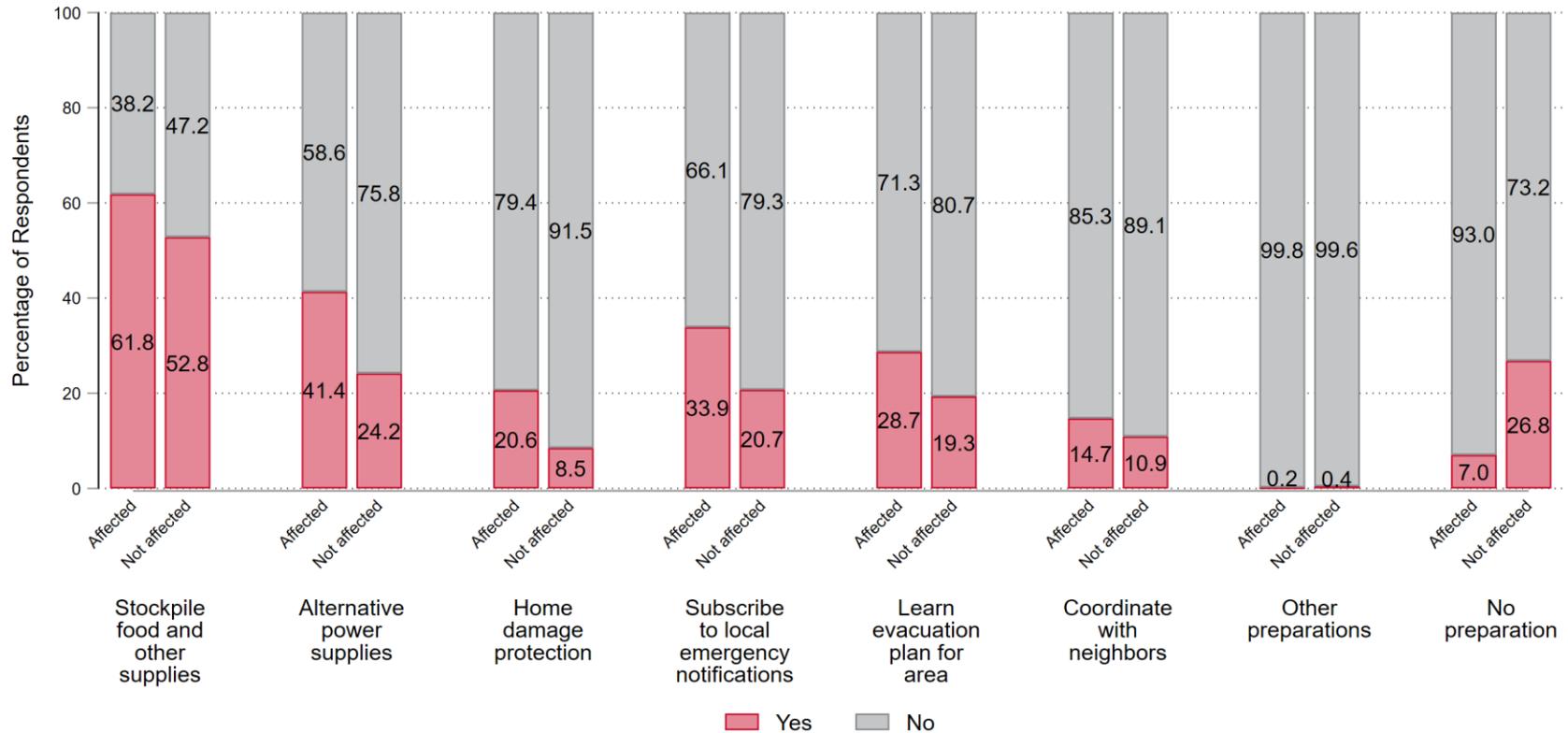

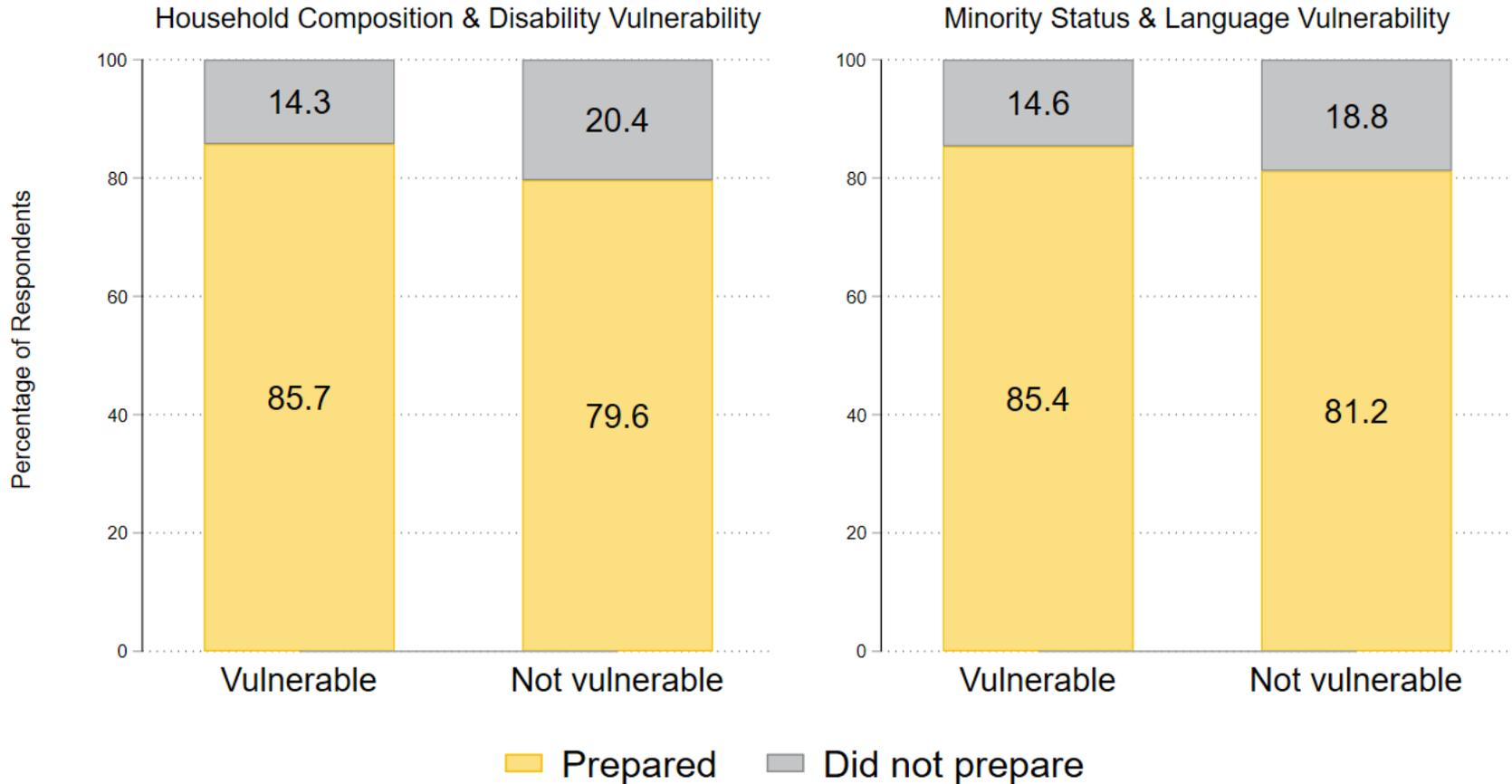

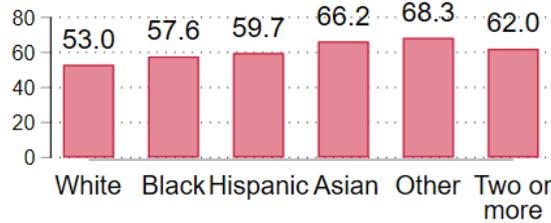

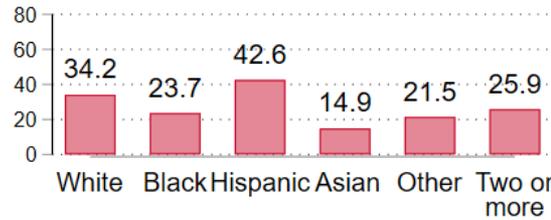

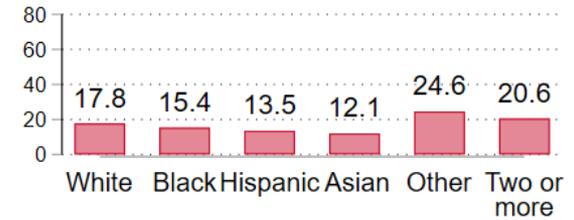

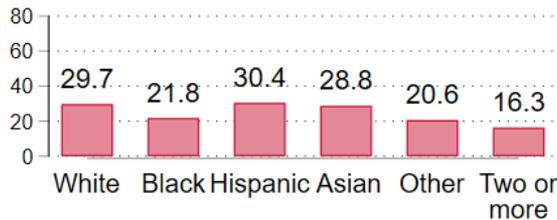

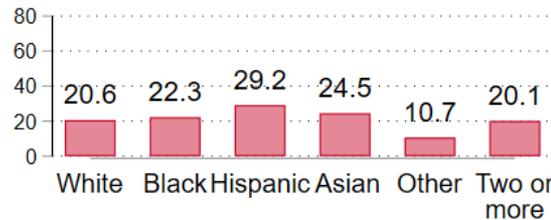

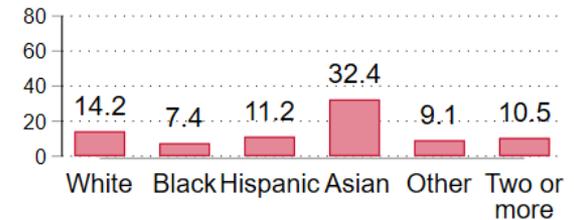

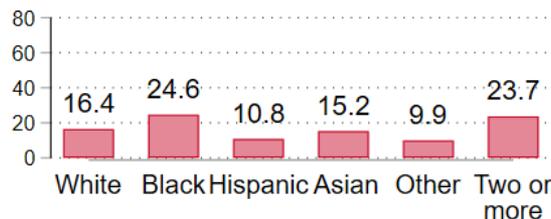

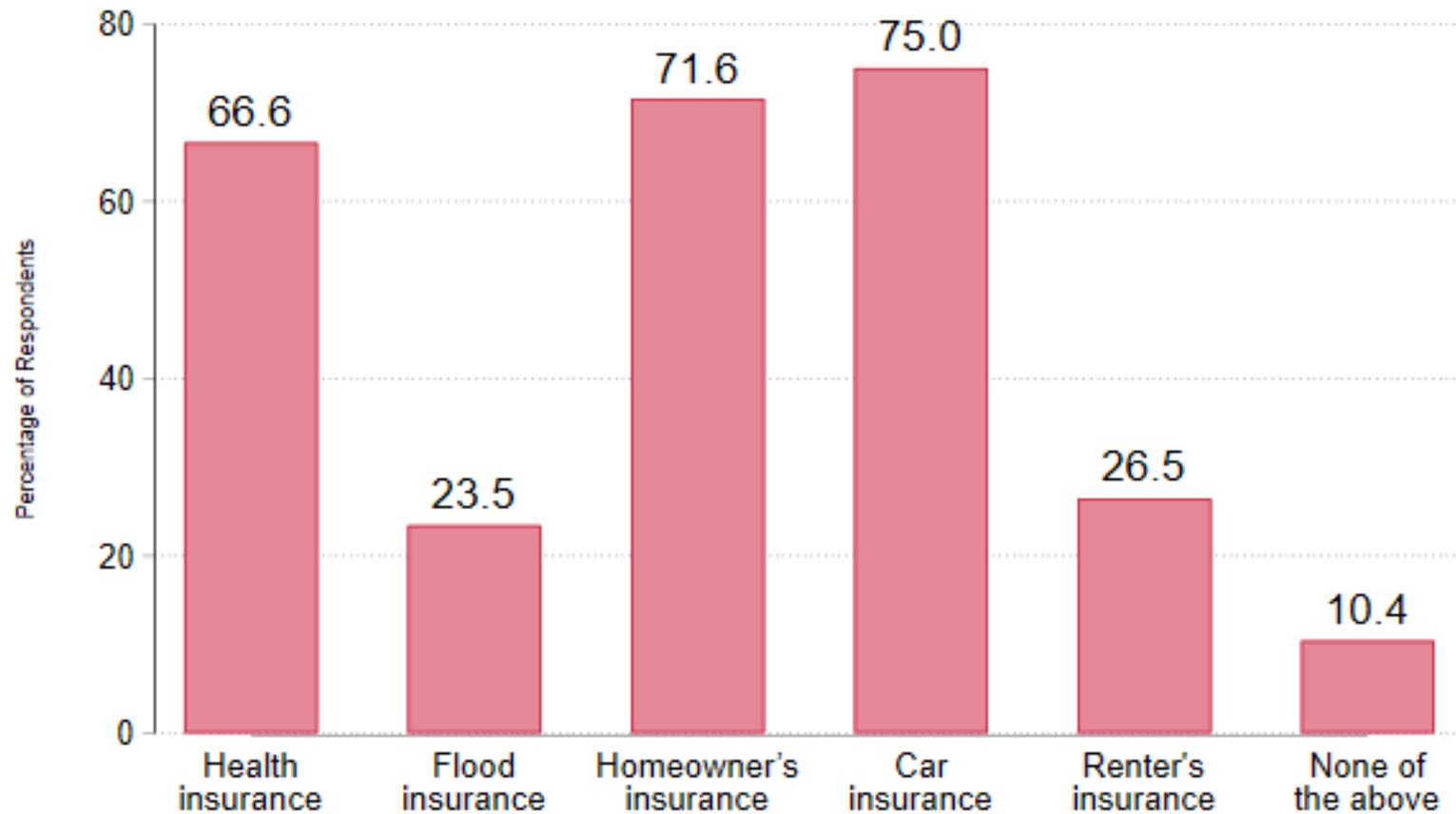
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# Adaptive Capacity

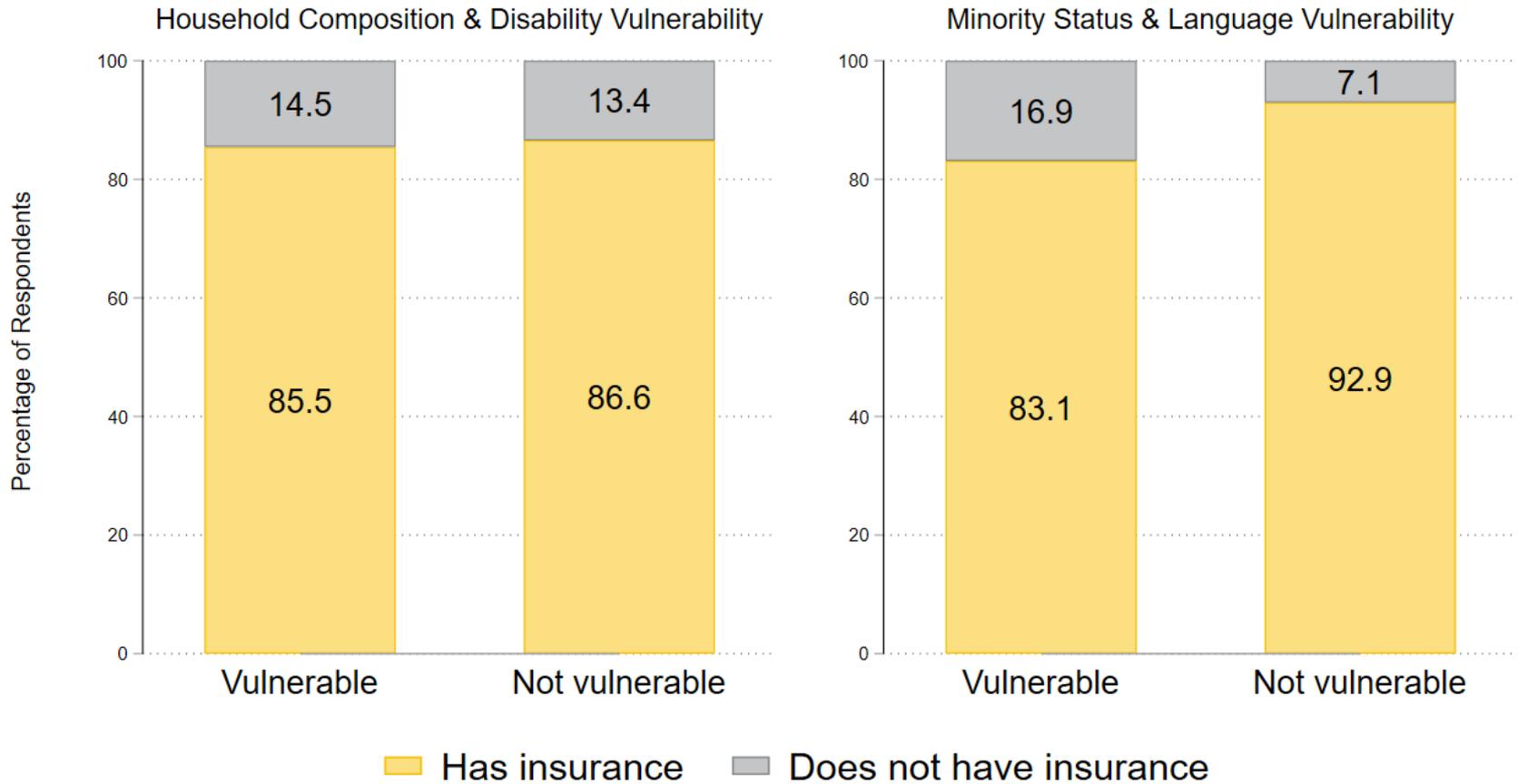
- ▶ Those affected by natural disasters were more likely to have insurance
- ▶ Vulnerable populations are most likely to have insurance compared to the non-vulnerable populations
- ▶ Insurance rates are positively related to higher income respondents, specifically for homeowners and flood insurance



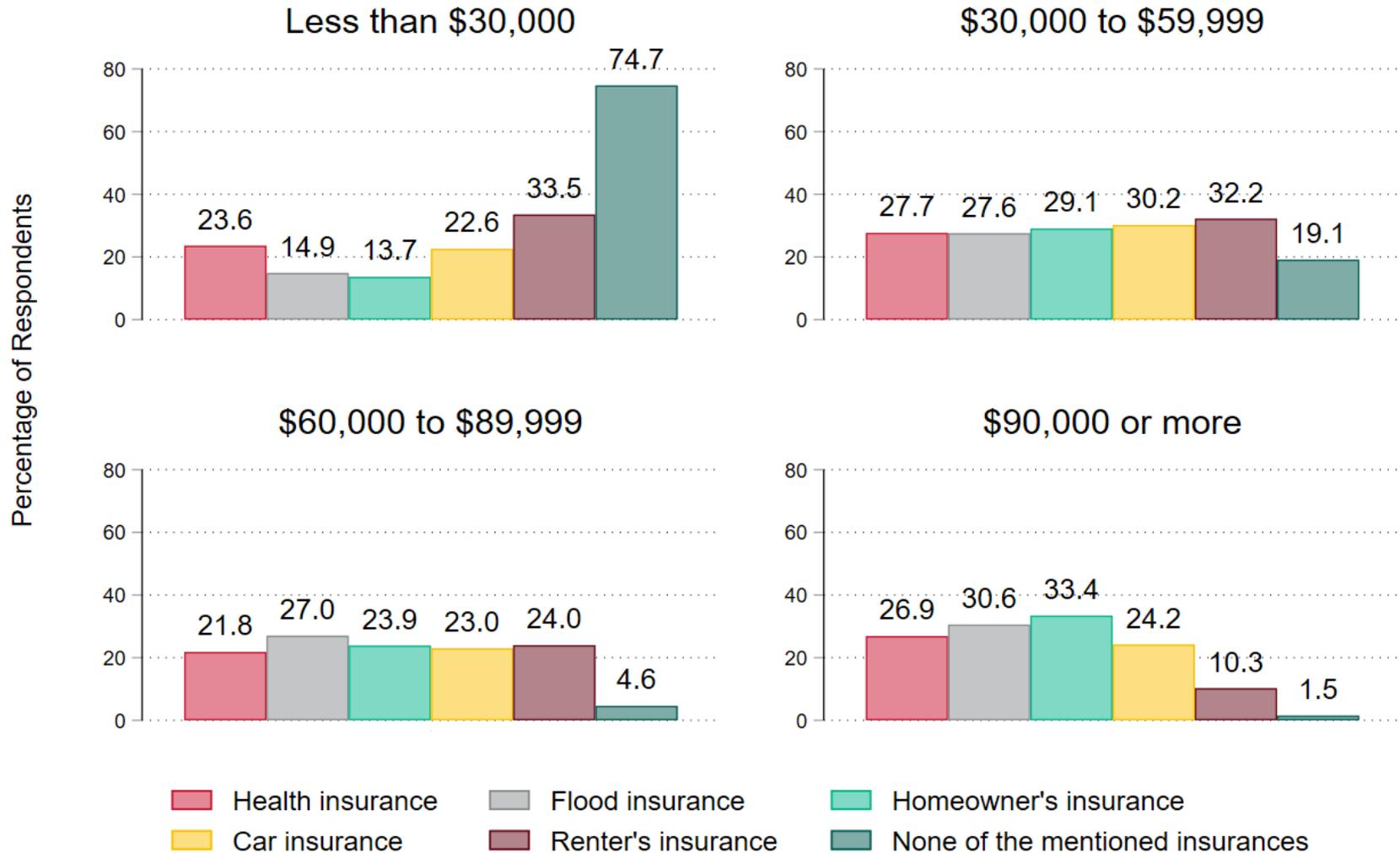

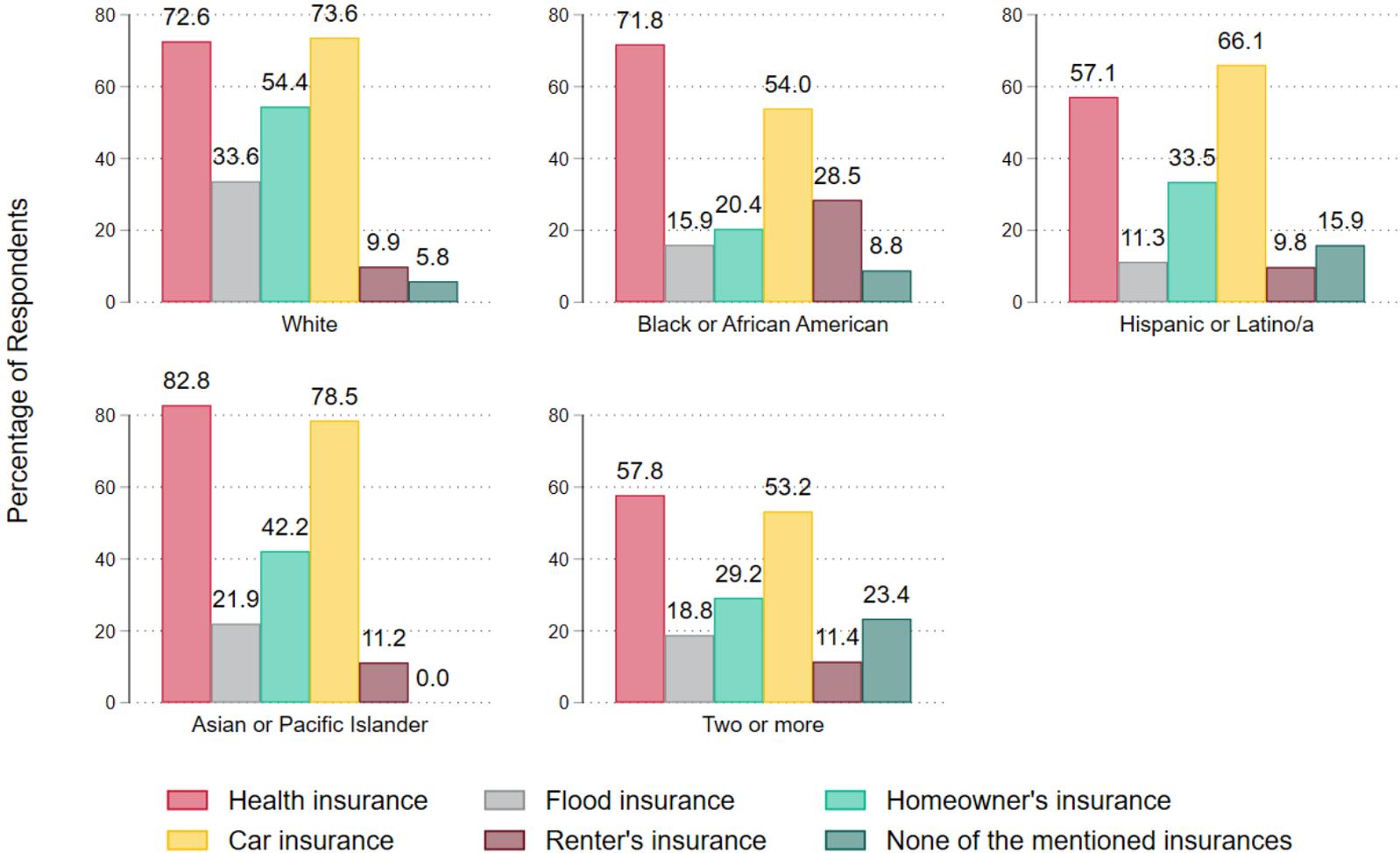
# Insured and Uninsured by Vulnerability Type

# Recovery



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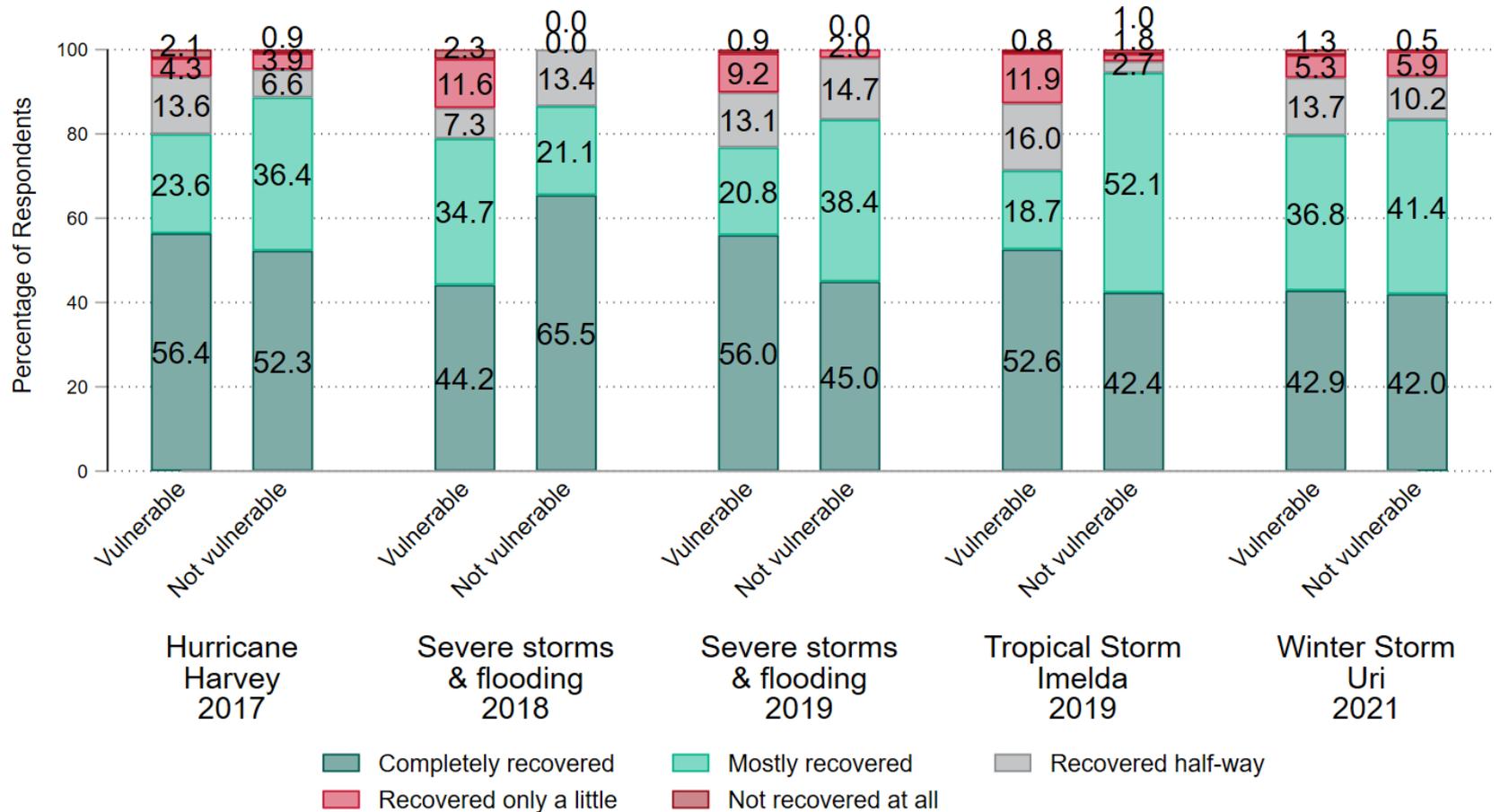
# Recovery

- ▶ Respondents in Harris County are resilient
  - ▶ Higher recovery rates compared to other areas of Texas
- ▶ Non-vulnerable respondents have higher recovery rates than vulnerable respondents
- ▶ Tropical Storm Imelda and severe storms and floodings of 2019 show the highest non-recovery rates for vulnerable respondents
- ▶ No apparent correlation between FEMA and GLO applications and recovery
- ▶ Strong correlation between insurance attainment and recovery
  - ▶ Overall, those insured have higher recovery rates



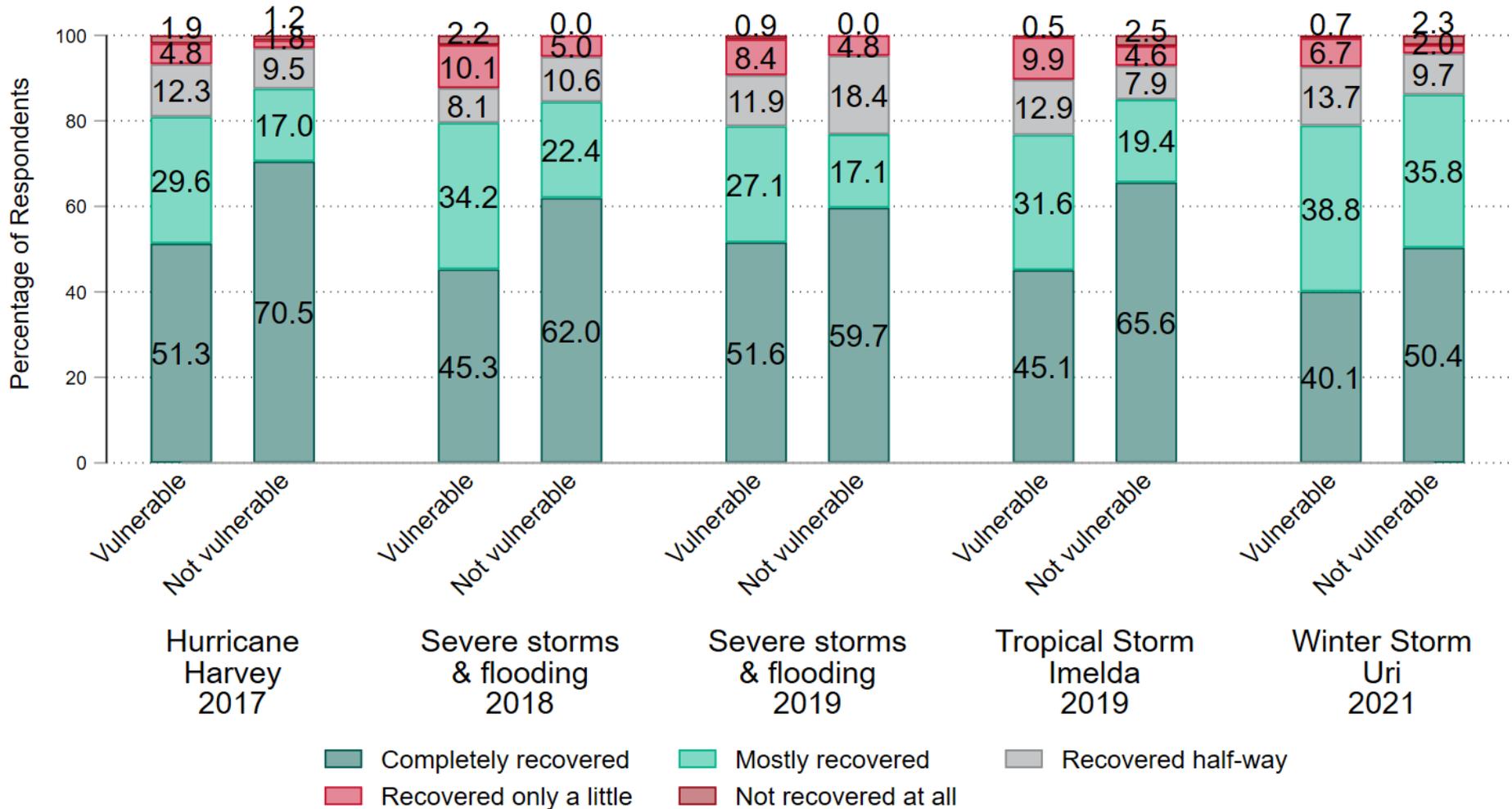

## Recovery by Household Composition & Disability Vulnerability in Harris County



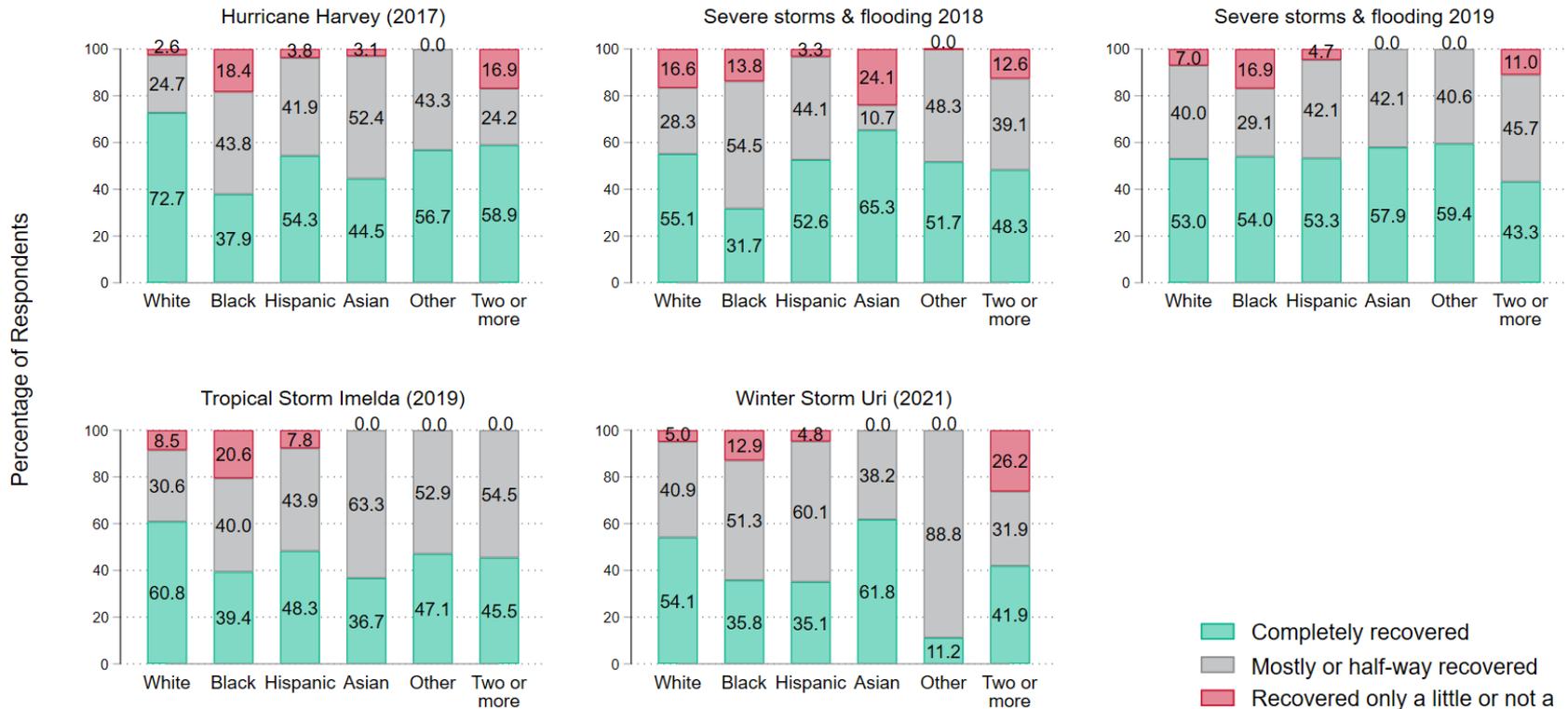

Percentage of Respondents

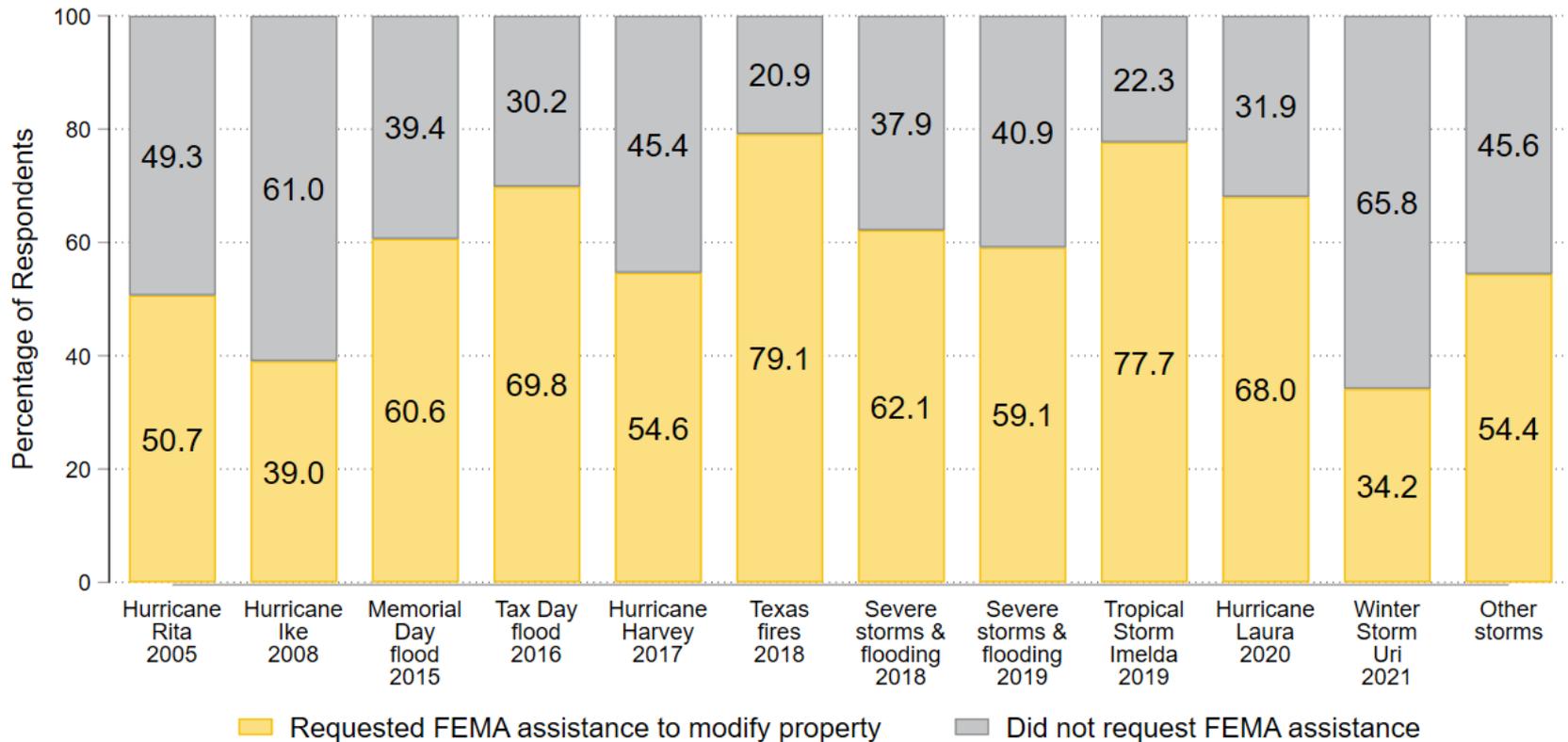


- Completely recovered

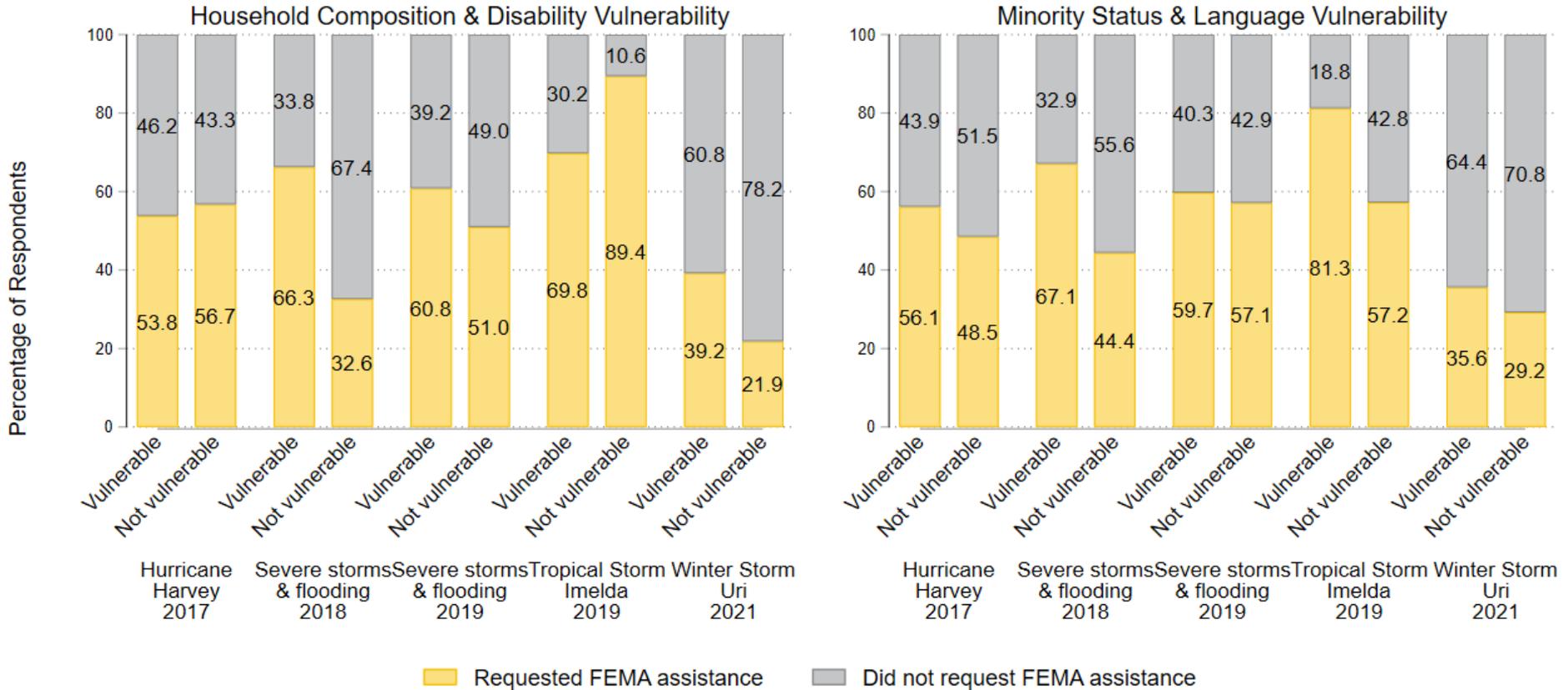

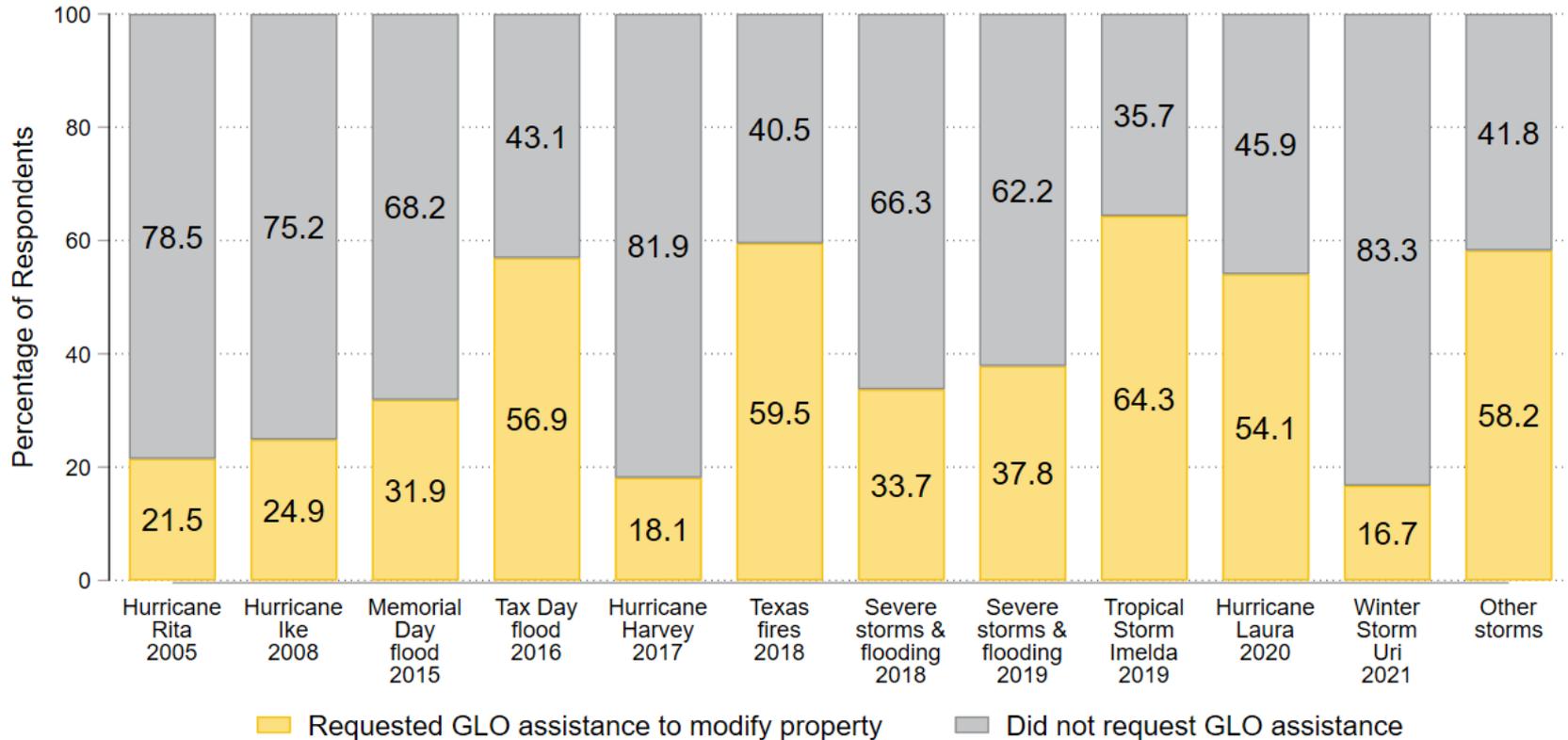

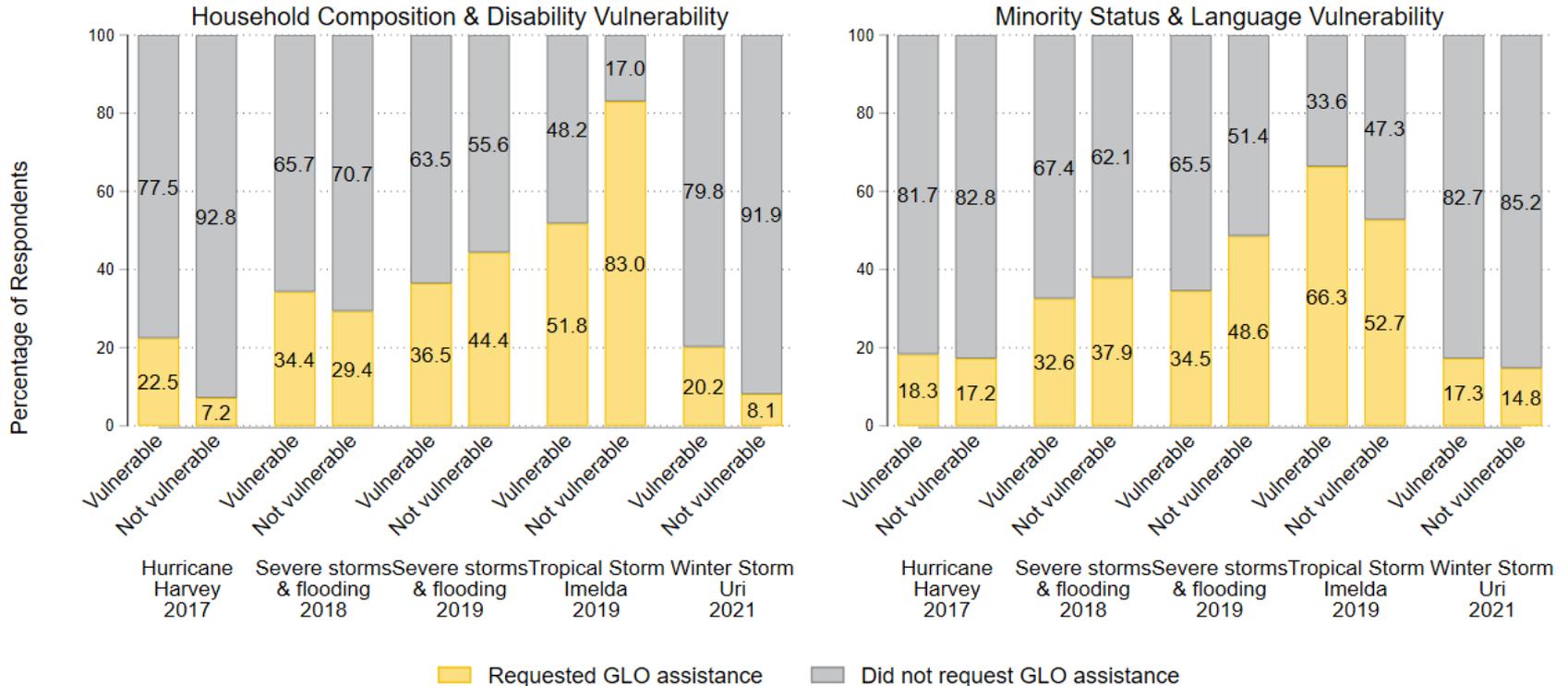

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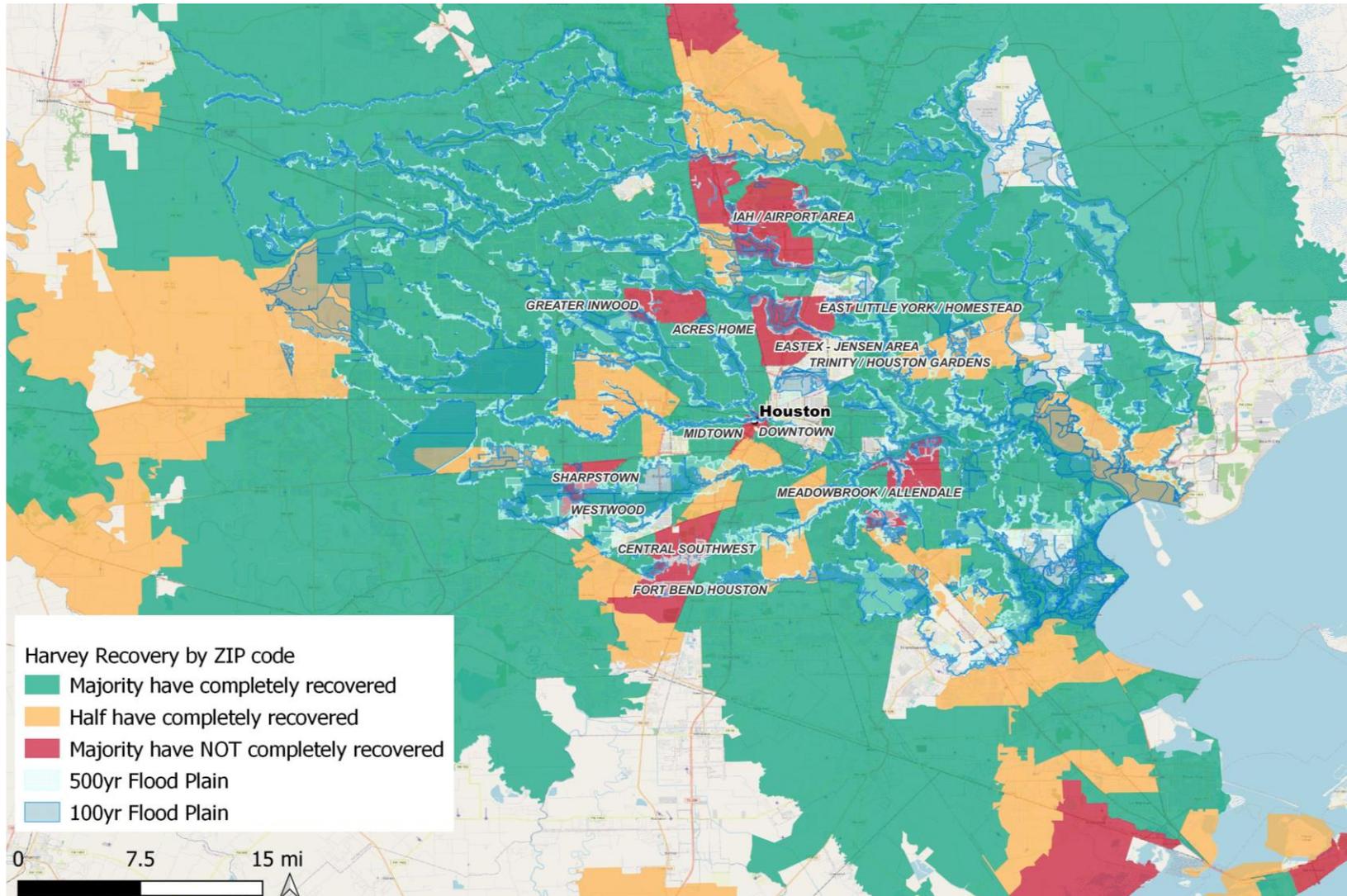
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# Hurricane Harvey Recovery

- ▶ Some areas in Harris County have not completely recovered from Hurricane Harvey
  - ▶ Areas in the Northeast and Southwest that are also highly vulnerable, specifically to Household Composition & Disability Vulnerabilities
- ▶ Respondents from Harris County recovered at higher rates than those in the rest of Texas from damages caused by Hurricane Harvey
  - ▶ This was true regardless their vulnerability status

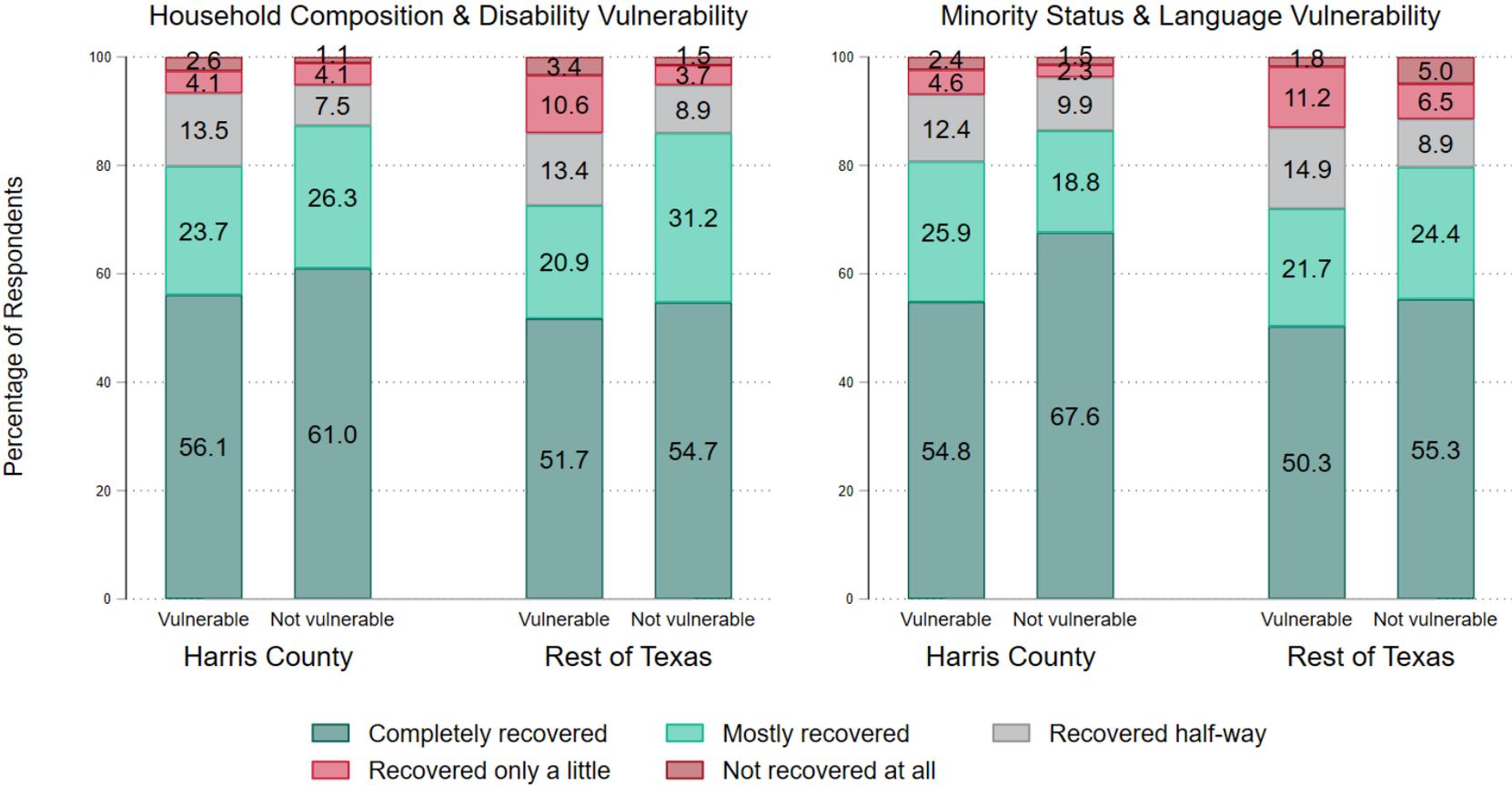

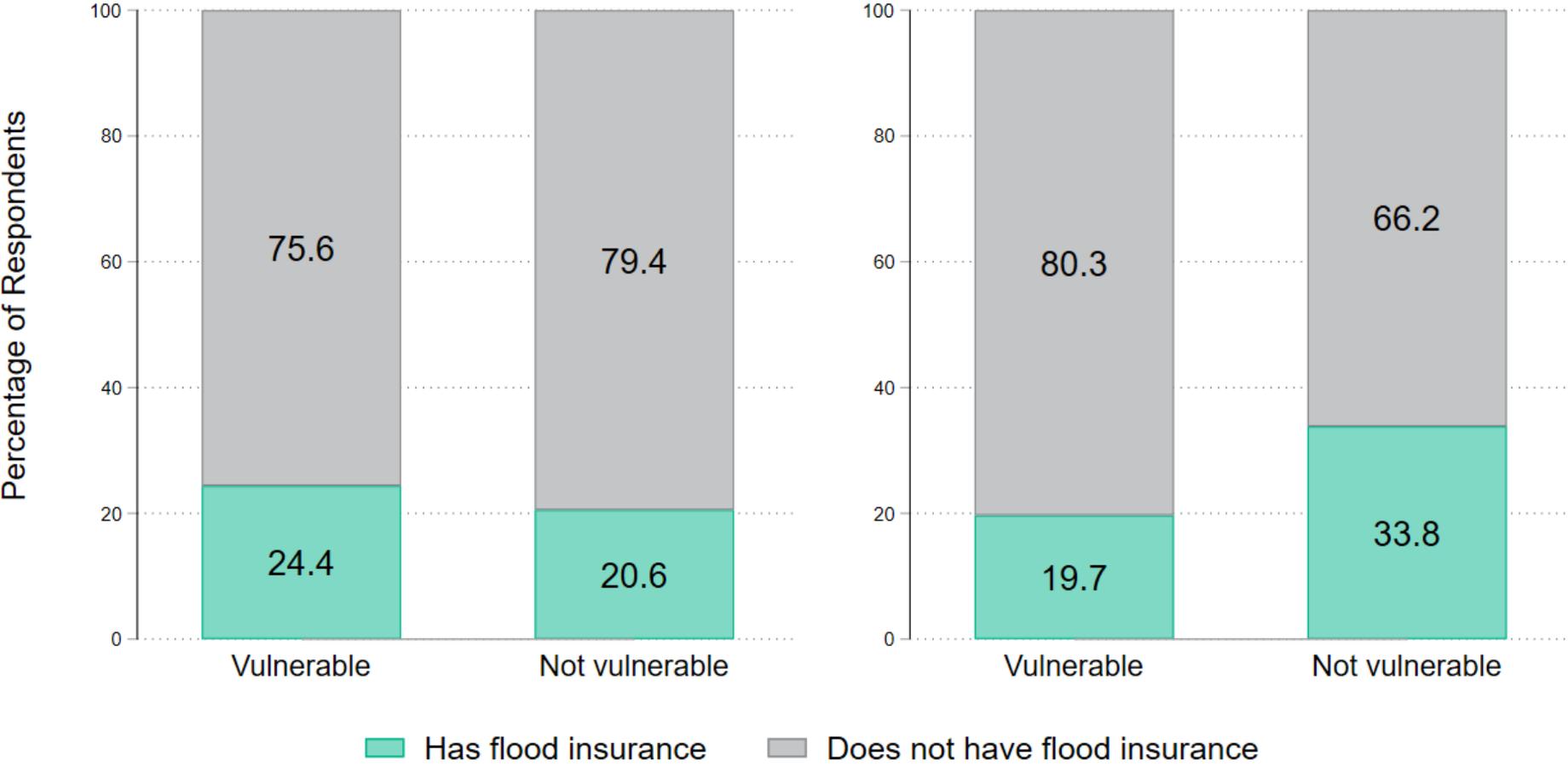

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# Policy Considerations

- ▶ The impact of Hurricane Harvey in the Greater Houston area is still prevalent nearly five years later
- ▶ Even when vulnerable populations prepare for natural disasters, they take longer to fully recover than non-vulnerable populations
- ▶ In Harris County, the ethnoracial categorization has different characteristics than the global minority categorization
- ▶ Insurance attainment mattered for full recovery after a natural disaster, more than government assistance such as FEMA and GLO



# Policy Considerations

- ▶ Policies that aim to mitigate the effects of natural disasters are not one-size-fits-all
- ▶ While the CDC-SVI is widely used for policy making decisions at the local level (e.g., COVID vaccines distribution or food banks location), it is a broad measure that does not include specific characteristics of each community
- ▶ Survey research is limited:
  - ▶ Hard to reach populations are usually not captured
  - ▶ There is a need for a better understanding of underserved areas

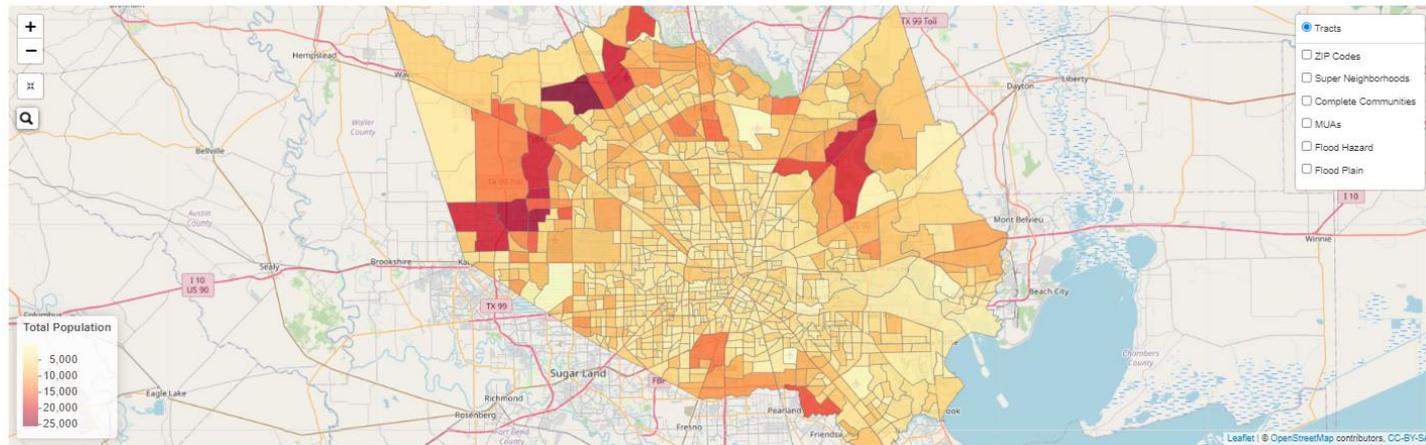
